From the office of the PRESIDENT

10-10 International

he usual thing to do at the end of the year is to review the past year, to see what is new and what has changed; what goals have been accomplished and what still requires work to be done. Well here goes!

My earliest goal upon assuming the Presidency in January 2007 was to make 10-10 more visible in the ham community. That first year, besides attending the Dayton Hamvention I also made it to HamCom in Plano, Texas. This year I added HamCation in Orlando and Boxboro in Massachusetts to my list of ham radio gatherings. But it was not just me who was representing 10-10 at these and other hamfests. Directors Bob Farrow, Ken Harmon, Rob Ireland, Leslie Johnson, Treasurer Keith Schlottman and many others manned booths at local and state hamfests handing out 10-10 material and giving forums on 10-10. Some of these folks as well as many others presented programs to their local clubs and also passed out 10-10 material to prospective members. As 10 meters starts to come alive this year, I want to encourage all to get involved and spread 10-10's message. At the last Board meeting, the Convention and Hamfest budget was increased. If you are interested in working in a booth, giving a presentation, let me know, 10-10 can help with some of the expense.

This year, I will be at Orlando's HamCation from February 13-15, Dayton's Hamvention from May 15-17, and at Plano's HamCom from June 12-13. I am also working on attending the Charlotte, North Carolina Hamfest on March 13-14 and the Huntsville, Alabama Hamfest in August. I know many others will be on the road during the year as well. If you wish to join us at any of these hamfests or can make others, again let me know.

Mentioning Orlando, reminds me that assisting me in the booth will be Director Leslie Johnson, WA4EEZ, #15675, my wife, Linda, KA6SPS, #69700 and members of the Cypress Chapter, who are also the host chapter for the July 10-10 Convention. If in the Orlando area stop by say hello and learn more about the convention.

Along with attending hamfests, 10-10 started advertising in QST, CQ, and WorldRadio. These have resulted in many inquires from old members asking to find their lost 10-10 number and then renewing and also many prospective members making inquires about our organization. These activities have resulted in approximately 500 new members at a time of minimum solar activity. This year 10-10 will be adding advertisements in the publications of Canada, England, and Germany.

Another noteworthy event during 2008 was the redesign and completely new web site. It had been decided to redo the web site several years before I became President and after several attempts at improvement the task was still years away. Last January I made a list of what I wanted to see on the web site: an on-line new and renewals membership function and an on-line membership roster with the ability to make inquiries not only by call or 10-10 number but with wild cards in the call, name and location. In February, after several discussions with Director Jack Moore and List Manager Mel Sojka about the capability and cost of our then current web site, I asked Jack and Mel to do a study on the current web and of other available sites. Mel completed this task and after a full review of the results, I asked Mel to make a presentation before the Board at the May Meeting. The result of Mel's study was that the current site had no other function available except that of the listsery and the cost was 3 to 4 times higher than other available sites at the time of the study. At the Board meeting, Mel made his presentation and after discussion it was decided to move the web to a new site and at the same time do the redesign.

As we have learned, all things did not go as initially planned. The capabilities of the List on the new site were to say the least, 'extremely limited', only allowing for 100 members. Mel queried the provider and I reviewed the start up and training material. We should have realized something was amiss when their documentation showed the number stopping at 100. Mel moved the list serve to his server, temporarily as he sought out possible solutions. Most web providers have moved away from Lists or allow for only limited members because of inherent problems that managing them has become. The choice left was to return to the old provider, shut down the List or go to Yahoo. Since there is already an active 10 meters list on Yahoo and most members also belong to that one I made the choice to shut the list down and concentrate our efforts on the Forums and Chat rooms.

The addition of the forum did not come about easily. Someone was able to imbed a foreign web address into it and redirect those who signed on. In order to use the forum, which is open to all amateurs you first must register. Your call must be your logon and will be validated prior to being allowed to use the forum. There are advantages and disadvantages of a forum over a list. With the forum you don't receive emails for every message left but at the same time you don't received unwanted emails either. messages left on the forum remain whereas you must save the list if you want to save the contents. There are other pros and cons but I am sure that after this initial period, while we become familiar with the forum, any remaining concerns will disappear. We will continue to add new topics and refine the process well into 2009. As of this writing over 170 individuals has signed up to use the forum.

The Chat rooms could prove an interesting addition. During QSO parties and nets they could prove useful in helping members and non-members to contact each other, use of which is allowed in 10-10 QSO Parties. During the recent W6OI special event, I made no contacts and went into the chat room several times wondering if anyone else was

thinking the same. I found several others doing the same thing and had a short chat.

One advantage of the new web site is the ability to add new features and functions. You may already have noticed that several Officers and Directors have new 10-10 email addresses. These will remain only available to the Board until a policy can be written defining its use. Another advantage will be the availability to conduct polls and gauge member reactions to various topics as the need arises. The QSL Manager's collection of those who have envelopes and/or cards on file was added and an inquiry was added to search the file rather than require a visual search of the various lists. In the planning stage is the addition of a searchable membership roster, along with a member and nonmember renewal/application page. Other items are in the discussion or thought phase. Stay tuned! Check out the web to see what's new!

As we start the year we can only hope that band conditions soon improve. It would again be nice to be able to check into nets and say hi to our fellow members. I want to thank everyone who has remained loyal to 10-10 during this solar minimum. Reading some of the current propagation reports, this minimum has been one for the ages, lasting much longer that those in the recent past. I especially want to thank the DX members who have remained active. We look forward to better band conditions and again working the world on 10.

Have a Happy New Year and let us all hope for a year of peace and prosperity.

INFORMATION To help you decide On the best Antenna for you



In each issue of the News, we shall try to clarify a significant cluster of ideas in antenna work. Our object is to help you make the best decisions about the antennas you buy or build without imposing our own prejudices on you. The more you understand, the better your choices will be.

4-Element Very-Wide-Band 10-Meter Beam

n episode 53 of this series, I presented a short-boom, wide-band 10-meter beam that used 2-driver elements fed with a phase line, plus a single director. Although it used a shorter boom than most 2-element Yagis, the antenna showed higher gain and a much-improved front-to-back ratio. We may further improve performance by adding one more element to the antenna, with a few adjustments to the dimensions of the other elements. The total boom length is less than 10'. **Fig. 1** shows the general layout of the antenna. Note the new reflector element.



The general outline does not include element lengths, because the exact lengths will depend on the method of construction and the length of each section of tubing that makes up each element. For these notes, I have selected sections of 5/8", ½", and 3/8" tubing. The inner sections, as shown in Fig. 2, are the same for all elements. Hence, only the tip sections (3/8" tubing) will change from one element to the next. I recommend the use of high-quality 6063-T832 tubing for a project like this. Hardware outlet tubing may not be strong enough to withstand long spells in changing winds and weather. For these elements, stainless steel sheet metal screw are fine for linking element sections. Use 2 screws at each junction.




Table 1 lists the dimensions for the elements. These dimensions assume that the individual elements are insulated and isolated from any conductive boom a builder might use—or that the boom is non-conductive. In general, a 10' length of PVC would be too heavy for this small beam, so I recommend the use of aluminum tubing—about 1.25" in diameter—plus the use of polycarbonate plates and U-bolts to handle both the elements and the boom. All hardware should be stainless steel, both to prevent rust and to eliminate electrolysis between conductors made from different metals.

Like the 3-element beam in episode 53, the 4-element beam derives its wide-band characteristics from the use of phased drivers. **Fig. 3** shows the general construction of the 250- Ω phaseline and the drivers. Although the sketch shows the polycarbonate plates, it omits the U-bolts. 6" by 9" plates should secure the elements safely to the boom.



Since you need only 24.6" of phase-line (plus a bit of extra for connections to the elements), you likely should make your own. The following table lists the center-to-center spacing for $250-\Omega$ lines using some common bare copper wires, listed by AWG size.



You will need spacers about every 3" to maintain the wire spacing accurately. The best way to make spacers is to drill the wire holes in a long strip of plastic (such as polycarbonate or similar). Then cut the spacers to size after you complete the drilling. Do not make the holes too large; you want a tight fit. If you do not de-burr the holes, the spacer will tend to stay in place through all kinds of weather. However, you

may also fix the spacers in place by adding a tiny drop of super-glue to the junction of spacer to wire.

See episode #53 for further construction hints. The entire beam weights only 12-15 pounds, depending on the exact construction method. Hence, you can support it on a light-duty tower or even a mast—if not too high and if well guyed.

Although the antenna provides as much gain as any Yagi that uses a boom shorter than 10 feet, gain is not the main feature of the antenna. Rather, the hallmark of the antenna is its consistent performance all across the first MHz of 10 meters. Fig. 4 shows free-space patterns for the beam at the passband edges and at the center frequency. Note that there is very little change in the appearance of the three patterns.




To confirm the impression left by the patterns, Table 2 lists some essential performance data at the sampled frequencies. From the data, you can infer the numbers for the intermediate frequencies.

Between the lowest CW frequency and the beginning of the FM portion of 10 meters, the gain changes by only about 0.2 dB. The front-to-back ratio is 23-dB or higher across the operating passband. In addition—as shown in the curve in **Fig.** 5 the SWR never climbs to 1.4:1 anywhere in the band.



The phasing system that uses 2 driver elements does not produce a deep SWR null, that is, 1:1. However, it is designed to show a very low figure at every operating frequency within the first MHz of 10 meters.

In fact, consistent performance is the design goal of this beam. There are 3-element Yagis that perform as well using the same boom length. For the cost of one more lightweight element and an easily constructed phase line, we obtain the closest thing to flat performance curves across the band. In fact, with just a little re-design, one might be able to use the beam over the entire 1.7 MHz of 10 meters.

In the course of these 62 explorations of antenna ideas, we have looked a many different designs for beams. There is simple way to judge which one is the best. What is best is what fits your needs, desires, and limitations. The present 4-element design with phased drivers shows that there may be no end to the variations on beams for 10 meters.



Many DX'ers and contesters used that site to watch for DX spots during a contest for new contacts or to log a new country. So visit the new site and save it in your online favorites.

The DX season continues at a slow crawl with most of the DX activity on twenty and fifteen meters. Our 10-10 members are having no fun with the minimum solar flux conditions. So far in 2008, there have been 248 spotless days on the Sun, August had no spots the entire month and we still have three weeks to go before 2009 begins a new year. During this past quarter, there have been a few more Cycle 24 spots displayed on the surface of the Sun which means more signs of the start of Cycle 24. I sure would appreciate a great band opening during the holidays for all of us to enjoy this Christmas.

The ARRL Ten Meter Contest has just ended as I finish this article. Before the contest, I knew that there had been many days of no sunspots, so the solar flux was at a minimum. There were no solar flares to boost the flux this past weekend, so I had predicted fewer contacts this year as compared to 2007. I was right about conditions, as I only worked 240 SSB contacts all weekend with most of those coming with a nice opening on Sunday. Several larger stations in the Houston area did a better job of working the weak signals with their tall towers and bigger yagi's. But total contacts will be down from past years. Good luck in December 2009.

Propagation: Propagation continues to be poor as the last good opening was during the Ten Meter Contest in December 2007. What a long wait as it is now one year later and Solar conditions have not changed all year.

Expect the daily solar flux to range from **68-85** the next quarter and the monthly flux will stay below 94 until Solar Cycle 24 is jump started officially by NOAA. **On December 14**th **the solar flux was 69 the A index 0 and K index 1** which is the same as the last six months. X-ray emissions from the sun have not improved and the flux remains at a minimum with a small chance of a storm or flare from the sun.

Expect the best conditions on Dec. 27-30th, January 1-4th, 2009; February 27-28th and March 26-29th. Over the next four months, for USA stations, expect a 20% chance of DX in the mornings to Asia, Europe or Africa and a 30% chance into South America or the Pacific in the afternoon. To tell what DX paths are open, use the beacons from 28.175-28.300 (especially 28.200).



10-10 Scholarship Applicant Information

his year the 10-10 International Net, through our non-profit corporation, the 10-10 Scholarship Foundation, funds four \$1500.00 scholarships, which are administered on its behalf by the Foundation for Amateur Radio (FAR).

Dianne Zimmerman, AA3OF, Chairman of FAR's Scholarship Committee, announced the four most recent winners of the 10-10 Scholarships in the October 2008 10-10 International News. Over the past 21 years, 10-10 has funded 75 scholarships valued at \$73,000.

pplicants must be licensed radio amateurs. There is no restriction on the course of study, but applicants must intend to seek at least an Associate degree from a college or university. Non U.S. amateurs and those seeking graduate degrees are eligible. Foreign members should be aware that students who study outside the United States are also eligible to receive a 10-10 Scholarship.

t is suggested that every 10-10 member encourage qualified college bound radio amateurs to take advantage of this opportunity by requesting an application package by letter or QSL card prior to April 30 of each year from:

P.O. Box 831 Riverdale, MD 20738

Applicants, except those who are active 10-10 members must provide an endorsement from a current active 10-10 member (one whose dues are current).

Completed applications must be received by FAR prior to June 1 of each year.

INTERNET MANAGEMENT

On January 1, 2009 responsibility for managing the 10-10 internet functions moved from myself (K5CC) to Mel (KD5DE). I assumed responsibility for management of the QSO Parties. I wish to thank the officers and members who supported me the past few years and look forward to my new duties. Mel is eminently qualified to manage the internet functions and has got an early start in modernizing the 10-10 Website and creating new venues for members to communicate through the internet. I asked Mel to summarize what he has done to date which is shown in the following paragraph.

In an effort to put 10-10 in the internet mainstream, at the San Antonio Board of Directors in May 2008, it was moved that Website be revised and transferred to a modern web hosting service. This move was not only cost effective but allowed for total control of the site and its contents. The move was to be made before January 1, 2009; but the move was completed ahead of schedule and the new Website was in place October 9, 2008. Several upgrades and additions were put in place: better site navigation, more security, a forum and a chat room. With the massive amount of junk mail now on the internet it was decided to replace the 10-10 Mailing List with a forum and the addition of a chat room has opened a new avenue of communications. Many more programs are being developed to give the members more tools to use the internet. As of this report we have had 25,000 visitors to the site and the two most popular items are the forum and the chat room.

Kingdom of Swaziland DxHoliday By WB6OJB



In 2006, Joan (XYL) and I had the pleasure of going to the Republic of Palau and operating an amateur radio. My call sign was T88AP.

It was a great experience to be the center of pile ups that would last for hours. I had never worked in conditions like that before and learned that I would do things a little differently if I ever got the opportunity again. I did have over 500 QSO's in 4 days of operating. That put the bug in me to try it again.

Joan and I go to southern Africa almost every year, on a photographic safari and to bring medical supplies to several clinics. One of my friends suggested I contact Dx Safari since they have many opportunities to operate from countries in that part of the world.

I looked up their web site, dxsafari.com, sent them an inquiring e-mail and that started another "great ham adventure". Andre Van Wyk, KR5DX (ZS6WPX) the founder of Dx Safari's sent me an email explaining what they had to offer. He offered 2 suggestions, the Kingdom of Swaziland or the Republic of Botswana.

Since we had been to Botswana, we picked Swaziland. We started the planning process in January 2008. We already had plans to be in South Africa in early September 2008 and I wanted to do the radio part of the trip before we went out into the bush.

My travel agent at VIP Travel in Brea, California had already set up the land trip in South Africa. I contacted him and explained that we wanted to be in Swaziland for 5 days before going to South Africa. VIP Travel contacted Andre and coordinated our travel plans. I sent a copy of my passport and radio license to Andrea and received my Swaziland call sign (3DA0JK) in about 6 months. Things always take longer in Africa, but it was worth the wait.

We left Los Angeles the 1st of September on Lufthansa Airlines heading for our first stop in Frankfurt, Germany (11 hours). We had a 10 hour layover and in the past we have taken short tours of the city and Main River. This time we had a day room at the airport Sheraton Hotel. They have a gym at the hotel with excellent equipment so I had a good workout on the treadmill. The next leg of our flight was to Johannesburg (9 hours) arriving at 10 AM. There's only 1 flight daily to Swaziland so we had a day layover in Johannesburg at the Sun Hotel. Another workout in the gym overlooking the runway, a long nap and excellent dinner in the hotel restaurant, Quills.

The next morning we were off to Matsapha Airport in Swaziland. We were met by Dan Hubbard, ZS6JR, who had driven to Swaziland from his home in Johannesburg with the radio equipment, The next time we would like to drive with him from Johannesburg and that would give me more time on thr air and a chance to see the countryside by car.

Dan was great! Not only was he my "Elmer" for the next 5 days, he was also our chaperone and a wonderful guide showing Joan and me the sites of interest in the area.

The resort where the radio's permanent antennae are located is the Hawane Resort (www.hawane.co.sz), located just outside of Mbabane, the capital of the Kingdom.

The accommodations are basic having flush toilets and showers. The dining room and food are first class. There are many things a tourist can do at the resort besides ham radio. There are backtrack trails, horseback riding, off road vehicles, and a nice swimming pool. There is no game viewing in the area. However, there is a private game reserve in Swaziland.

The radio was Yaesu FT 1000MP with an Icom 2K amplifier. The antenna system was a six element directional beam up about 70 meter. At home I ran 100 watts with a vertical, so this was a real treat. I operated on 40, 20, 17, and 15 meters. Most QSO's were on 20 Meters. 17 Meters opened up in the afternoon so I stayed there until about 7 or 8 in the evening when I would switch to 40 Meters. I tried working the "grey zones" and it worked fairly well with Australia. I worked very few on 15 Meters but did try. I listened on 10 Meters but heard absolutely nothing. Before I left, several suggested I work split. I am certainly glad I took their advice. The pile ups lasted from the time someone listed me on the DX cluster, until the time the XYL threatened bodily harm if I didn't shut down, about 12:30 AM. On several days Joan would bring me my meals and a little something so I wouldn't lose my voice.

I tried working North America but by the third day I had only worked one Canadian station, VE1TK, Mike in Nova Scotia. On the fourth day the United States and Canada opened up and I was able to make several contacts. On Sunday I was able to check into the MARCO medical amateur grand rounds net on 14.307 through Dan, W4DAN.

On Monday, the 8th of September, 0829 UTC, I had my last contact with JA6BDB and that ended my Swaziland DX Adventure.

Considering I was hand logging, I made 1696 QSO's in about 5 days of operation. From the number of QSL cards I have received, there are certainly a lot of hams who haven't worked Swaziland before. Now we're working on a DX safari for next year. Might be Swaziland again, or maybe Botswana.

I would like to thank ZS1I, Johan for several QSO's and good advice as to what areas to work at different times of the day. I also had the chance to meet Andy Cory, 3DA0TM, who inducted me into the Radio Society of Swaziland. There are only four Hams in the country and Andy is the only one active on the lower bands. I hope others will have the opportunity to work with Dan Hubbard. He was always there when I needed him and always seemed to know where I should be pointing the antennas. Some local hams I would like to thank for their input are Arnie, N6HC, Bob N6OPR, and AI, W6JNU.

From Mbabane we drove to South Africa and to Phinda Private Game Reserve which is south of Swaziland. We spent 5 days at the lodge, going on safari twice a day. There are more black rhino's in the Phinda area than almost anywhere else. The anti-poaching campaigns are working and both the black and white rhino population is increasing but still on the endangered list. Cheetah's are also abundant in the reserve.

From Phinda we flew in a small Cessna charter flight to the Sabi Sands area of Kruger National Park where we stayed at the Leopard Hills Game reserve for seven days. We've been to Leopard Hills many times and it's our favorite lodge in South Africa. The game viewing in the Sabi Sands is as good as it gets and we highly recommend this area.

All vacations have to come to an end and 33 hours after leaving the "bush" we landed at LAX. Tired but with great memories.

TEN-TEN QSO PARTY RULES

6.2 10-10 QSO PARTIES

10-10 QSO Parties are events that are held for fun and to meet old, new and prospective members around the world. The rules listed here are for all general QSO parties The Anniversary, Meet the Volunteers, and Mobile QSO Parties are specialty events and do have additional rules.

6.2.1 WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs with operating privileges on the 10 meter band, however logs will be accepted only from active members as of the date of the event. Other logs received will be handled as checklogs. Checklogs are used to validate (check) other logs but do not receive awards.

6.2.2 WHEN ARE THE QSO PARTIES?

There are currently seven QSO Parties held through the calendar year:

Winter Phone - held on the first full weekend in February

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Spring - held on the first full weekend in May.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Spring Digital - held on the first full weekend in May.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Summer Phone - held on the first full weekend in August.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Sprint - a 24 hour event held on October 10th (10-10).

0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.

Fall CW - held on the last full weekend in October.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 Sunday.

Fall Digital - held on the last full weekend in October.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

6.2.3 FREQUENCY AND MODES

Direct unassisted contacts only are permitted. Repeater, Satellite, IRPL or any other similar types of assisted contacts are NOT allowed.

Based on the appropriate band plan for the country of operator, CW, QSO Parties should be operated in the CW area of the 10 meter band and operated using CW only. Digital QSO Parties should be operated in the digital area of the 10 meter band and operated using Digital modes only (RTTY, PSK, etc). Phone QSO Parties must be operated in the PHONE area of the 10 meter band and may be operated using any approved method (SSB, FM, AM).

The SPRINT utilizes all operating modes in the 10 meter band.

NOTE: A QUIET ZONE between 28.490 and 28.510 shall be in effect during QSO Parties using the Phone portion of the 10 meter band to allow for others to use the hand

6.2.4 ENTRY CLASSIFICATION

Entrant may submit a log in ANY of the following classifications:

INDIVIDUAL: Includes single station operators and can also include OM/XYL teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers.

QRP: same as an individual as listed above except that output power does not exceed 5 watts with CW/Digital operations and/or 10 watts with Phone operations during the entire event.

CLUB: A Club must have a valid club station license issued by their National Licensing Authority. The club must have active 10-10 membership. Club entries must additionally list the call, name, and 10-10 number (if any) for all operators entering under a club entry an individual log for contacts made using their own call sign.

6.2.5 TRANSMITTER INFORMATION

An operator may operate mobile, portable or fixed. If they change their exchange QTH during the QSO Party, the operator must show same in their log. The operator may enter a log from one call district, province, or DX country. Multi-transmitters (two or more transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) are NOT permitted in any QSO Party. If a single transmitter becomes inoperable, it is permissible to change to a replacement transmitter.

6.2.6 EXCHANGE

10-10 members send call sign, name, 10-10 # and QTH (State, Province or Country). If received exchange does not have a 10-10#, then record a zero(0) in the log.

6.2.7 QSO POINTS

Two (2) points are awarded for contacts WITH a 10-10 number.

One (1) point is awarded for contacts WITHOUT a 10-10 number.

Duplicate entries should be retained in log and show a zero (0) for points.

Any log showing 10% or more errors may be handled as a checklog.

A station may be counted only once regardless of mode.

6.2.8 CHAPTER SCORE ASSIGNMENT

Any entrant who is a chapter member and whose operating location is within 150 miles of the primary net location of that charter, may assign the entrant's score to that chapter. QSO Party scores for the Sprint may not be assigned.

6.2.9 QSO PARTY ENTRIES

Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. It is strongly suggested that logs be sent as soon as possible after the close of the event. It is also recommended that DX logs should be sent AIR Mail to insure they are received in good time. Any logs received with a postmark date AFTER the deadline date will be handled as a checklog. Any logs received more than 15 days after the entry deadline, regardless of postmark, will be discarded.

6.2.9.1 ENTRY DESCRIPTION

Entries must contain a Cover Sheet, Log, and Dupe Sheet as described here:

COVER SHEET will list the Event Entered, Entry Classification, US Call Area (W0-W9) or DX Country, Chapter Score Assignment (if any), number of contacts and points with 10-10#, number of contacts and points without 10-10#, and total contacts and points claimed.

LOG must be listed in date/time order and list UTC Date, UTC Time, Call, Name, 10-10# (zero (0) if none), QTH and Contact Point Value.

DUPE SHEET is required for any logs exceeding 50 contacts. It may be either a list of all calls contacted in call sign order, or hand entered on a dupe sheet grid.

6.2.9.3 ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for all QSO Parties listed EXCEPT the Sprint shall be postmarked no later than 15 calendar days (this will always be a Monday) after the close of the event. Mailed entries for the Sprint (held on 10/10) shall be postmarked no later than October 25th, unless that day falls on a Sunday, than the postmark deadline shall be October 26th. 6.2.10 QSO PARTY RESULTS AND AWARDS

QSO Party results will be posted on the 10-10 web site about 15 days after the closing deadline for the event, and also printed in the 10-10 NEWS in the appropriate issue. Awards will be issued by the certificate manager for Top Ten Individual scorers in the World, the top Individual scorer in each US Call Area (W0-W9) and each DX Country, and for top QRP, CLUB and CHAPTER.

6.2.11 ANNIVERSARY QSO PARTY and MEET THE VOLUNTEERS

These events run from January 1 0001 UTC to December 31 2359 UTC.

In the Anniversary QSO Party, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members that have 10-10's anniversary year contained in their membership number.

Example: 2008 is the 46th anniversary year of 10-10 International Net, Inc. Contact with members containing a "46" in their membership number (i.e.,72046, 69465,64654, 46126, 00467) would count toward the event. Each year the anniversary number changes, making a new group of members the focus of the event and promoting the use of the 10-meter band. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

During the calendar year (January 1 through December 31) make legal 10-10 contacts with 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, QTH with members containing the anniversary year in their membership number as described above.

In the MEET THE VOLUNTEERS event, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members listed in the 10-10 NEWS as being a 10-10 volunteer. One contact per volunteer is permitted, regardless of mode of contact.

In both events, contacts must be made on the 10-meter band with any legal mode (AM, SSB, FM, PSK, CW, etc.).

All submitted logs must contain only one entry for each 10-10 number contracted. Contacts MUST be listed in 10-10 number order and each entry must list the 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, Name, QTH and Mode, in that order.

These events are for Individual entries as described in section 6.2.4 and certificates will be awarded for the TOP Ten, however all entrants will be listed in the 10-10 NEWS. Logs shall be forward to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. Logs MUST be postmarked ne later than January 15th of the year following the Anniversary QSO Party year entered. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

6.2.12 MOBILE QSO PARTY

This event is held on the third Saturday in March from 0001 to 2359 UTC. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

Fixed station contact mobiles, mobiles contact everyone. Mobile applies to vehicular, marine, aeronautical or other mode of transportation. If in doubt, contact the QSO Party Manager. A station operating a mobile entry must be a true mobile. Sitting in the driveway and using the base station antenna or amplifier, of using commercial power is not permitted. RV generators are permitted only if the generator is used while in transit (moving).

Operation while your vehicle is parked across a county line, occupying two counties, counts as two counties and two contacts. Marine and aeronautical mobiles must be able to establish counties of operation.

The on-the-air exchange shall be Call, Name, State, 10-10 Number (if member, zero (0) if not), and county (if applicable). Only counties in the USA, Canada and England may be used as a multiplier.

Count one point for each contact whether a member or not. Fixed stations multiply the number of contacts by the number of different counties worked. Mobile stations multiply the number of contacts by the number of different counties worked PLUS a bonus of the number of counties worked from.

All stations must submit separate logs for the counties worked from. Log scores will be combined by the QSO Party Manager.

Logs shall be forward to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. Logs MUST be postmarked no later than 14 days after the end of the event. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

6.2.13 FOR MORE INFORMATION

Current information about 10-10 and upcoming 10-10 QSO Parties is always available on the 10-10 web site. Cover sheets, logging forms and dupe sheets are also available for downloading or printing. The address is http://www.ten-ten.org. Any unanswered questions regarding the QSO Party rules may be forward to the QSO Party Manager.

MEMBERSHIP INFORMATION AND SERVICES

WOULD YOU LIKE TO JOIN 10-10?

Here is what you need:

- 1. You must hold a valid amateur operator license.
- 2. Your valid amateur operator license **MUST** authorize or qualify you for unsupervised transmitting operations in the ten meter amateur band under your own personal call sign.
- 3. You must make contact with ten members of 10-10 and submit a log listing all contacts, their 10-10 number, call sign, name, date of contact, and QTH (state/province/country). A new member application and contact log is available in Section 1 below.
- 4. You must remit dues for one or more years full membership. Fee schedule and payment information can be found in Section 2 below.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

Primary Membership

Primary membership is available with yearly dues, although there is a special incentive available when you pay for three years at once.

Family Membership

Family membership consists of a primary member and one or more family members who qualify as a 10-10 member (has made the necessary 10 contacts) and who reside at the same location and postal address. Family memberships run concurrently with that of the primary member. Add \$5.00 for each additional family member for each year. Only the primary member will receive a copy of the 10-10 News.

Life Membership

Life membership is available and may be paid in one lump sum or spread across two or three yeas. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Senior Life Membership

Senior life membership is available to anyone who is currently 65 years of age or older. Payment can be made as one lump sum or within a one year period. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Family Life Membership is no longer available

Club Membership

Club Membership is available to any Amateur Radio Organization which holds a valid Amateur Radio License. Application must be made by the club trustee. Dues are the same as the Primary member. No family or life memberships are available. Club members have all the same rights and privileges as primary members except clubs do not vote in elections.

WinIQ

WinIQ is a Windows based program that is updated monthly and is a cross reference between the call and 10-10 number. It can be found on the 10-10 web.

XXIP

XXIP is a DOS based program that is updated monthly and is a roster of 10-10 membership through 10-10 #75001. It is available free at www.lingerinc.com.

AN-TEN-TEN-NAS

AN-TEN-TEN-NAS is a book by L. B. Cebik containing 30 articles and designs for 10 meter antennas from the pages of the 10-10 NEWS. The price has been drastically reduced to \$5.00 USD or free if you renew for 3 years. You must also include the additional \$5.00 US or \$8.00 DX for shipping.


