Before writing I always go back and read what I have written in the last several issues of the NEWS. This time I got a chuckle out of how I started my article in the October issue, writing in September. I mentioned the cool summer and already seeing geese heading south. Now as I look out the window it is snowing, as it has been for the last three days and the weather forecast calls for blizzard conditions for tomorrow with wind chills down in the - 20 degree range for the next several days. Oh how I wish for September!

I would like to welcome all the new and returning Ten-Ten members that have joined us this past year. It was not a great year for 10 meter activity from most of world so let's hope that this year, 2010, finds that conditions improve and we again can make over the air contacts.

During this past quarter I have received several inquires about processing of the Credit Cards on the Ten-Ten web site. How is it accomplished and is it safe and secure? Let me begin with it is safe and secure and meets all of the requirements of the Payment Card Industry Data Security Standard (PCI DSS). The Shopping Cart process is a stand alone engine that has two parts. The first is the interface that was written to gather only Ten-Ten information and no financial data. This part acts as an entry into the Shopping Cart itself. This results in an email to the Data Manager containing Name,

Call, Ten-Ten number and the requested action. This first part is completed even if no further action is taken. I may add that this step results in a lot of emails that don't end with any further action. Upon entry into the Shopping Cart and depending upon the path taken, i.e., renewal, Life, New, or Club, a screen displays the various payment options. After making a selection and continuing to the checkout counter, the next step requires a sign-on and password. This has become the most confusing part as many have felt that they have already established a sign-on and password with other parts of the Ten-Ten web site. But because it is a stand alone function it requires its own sign-on and password. So after completing that step of repeated information that we most likely already know, you reach the final check out and can either supply the Credit Card information or confirm that a check will be in the mail!

Several things happen after the final entry is made. The transaction is stored on the shopping cart database, an email is generated to you and the Data Manager thanking you for using the shopping cart, and two other emails are sent to the Data Manager. One of these final two emails contains information about what that transaction was all about, i.e., Renewal, New, etc and the sales information and part of the credit card number. The other email contains more of the credit card information, but this is still not enough information to process the transaction. What is stored on the shopping cart database is not the complete credit card information but a third part. All three are required and need to be in the correct order to complete the transaction.

The Data Manager receives four emails. Before the credit card transaction can be processed the information the transaction must be validated. We have had Life members or new members try to renew,
members that pay the wrong amount and a variety of other errors. The rate of mistakes is extremely low, about two percent, but each one takes time to correct. If the credit card transaction was completed before the validation, the correction process would be more difficult to process.

TheData Managerhas an on-line link to the creditcard processor through his computer. This processing is also safe and secure. In order to process transactions through a computer, a third independent party, with the credit card processor's and the Data Manager's agreement, checks the computer and links each month to ensure that it is secure. When the Data Manager is unavailable for periods of a week or longer the shopping cart and his computer are shut down. After the monetary transaction is completed the Data Manager processes the Renewal, Life or New application.

To date over 420 members have taken advantage of this membership option. The number may not seem like a considerable number but of the current 4800+ active members, there are 2800+ with multiyear, Life or Senior Life membership.

Join with we me, my wife, Linda, KA6SPS, \#69700 and Director Leslie Johnson, WA4EEZ \#15675, and Committee Member Paul Hemby, WN4AMO, \#73825 attending HamCation in Orlando, Florida from February $12^{\text {th }}$ through February $14^{\text {th }}$. We will be in Booth 26 in the Commercial 1 area. This is becoming an increasingly popular hamfest in the southeast. For more information on HamCation refer to their web page at www.hamcation.org. This year Ten-Ten will again be at the Dayton Hamvention and HamCom. I know that during the year TenTen will make appearances at other hamfests and conventions. If you would like to support Ten-Ten at
these or other events please let me or any Director know several months in advance so adequate supplies can be made available.

2010 is an election year, Director Rob Ireland, VE9KM, \#69811 is the Nomination Committee Chairperson. Other members of the Nominating Committee are AI Kaiser, N1API, \#25468 and Garry Miller, KA6GPC, \#43555. In 2010 the President, Vice-President, Secretary and four Director positions are to be elected. The term for President, VicePresident, and Secretary is for two years and for Directors, four years. Do you just sit around and wonder why things never go your way or it seems like your opinion doesn't matter? Get involved, run for an office and participate in the future of Ten-Ten. Elsewhere in this NEWS is the election process and schedule. Don't wait until the Nomination Committee contacts you. They probably don't know of your interest. Contact Them!

Let me close with the wish for everyone to have had a Happy Holiday season and that 2010 is every thing that you wish for.

Speedway: Requirements for Membership: Work 1 SQ (Special Qualifier) or CL (Charter Local), and submt QSO info along with a statement of Paid Up 10-X Dues, and 2 First Class Stamps (If you want a paper Certificate). If you wish a Membership Number Only, you can Submit just the SQ or CL QSO info, with a Request for a Number Only along with a SASE if using Snail Mail. If you have a 10-X number, and are not currently a paid up dues member you may still participate as a Speedway Chapter Member anyway without a Certificate of Membership, and will be ineligible to obtain a $5 \times 9$ Award. You Will have a Membership Number, and will still have full chapter upgrade, and participation privileges, and Special participation privileges as well. All are encouraged to remain 10-X Paid up Dues Members. ALL participation QSO's MUST be made over the Air ON the 10 Meter Band. NO Internet QSO's please! All requests, and submissions may be made via Email or Snail Mail (your choice). Snail Mail requests, and submissions must include an SASE for a Snail Mail response.

## Upgrade program:

Upgrades may be submitted either through Email or Snail Mail. Snail Mail Upgrades must include SASE. Point Upgrades are based on contacts, and their points.

## Seals program:

Seals are based on the 7 Communication \& Safty Flages used at most Motor Sports events IE: NASCAR, USAC, World of Outlaws, and all Tracks/Speedway around the world. Seals are as follows.
\#1. GREEN FLAG + 5pts for U. Requires 25 ctx \& your pts have reached 100
\#2. YELLOW FLAG +7 pts for U. Requires 50 ctx \& your pts have reached 200
\#3. Blue Flag +10 pts for U. Requires submit 75 Green \& 75 Yellow Flag Seals
\#4. Black FLAG +15 pts for U. Requires 125 ctx + your pts have reached 450 pts
\#5. RED FLAG + 17pts for U. Requires ctx + 100 of each previous Flag Seals
\#6. WHITE FLAG +20 pts for U. Requires $250 \mathrm{ctx}+100$ of each previous Flag Seals
\#7. CHECKERED FLAG + 100 pts for U. Requires ctx +100 of each previous Flaf Seals
Points rate $=1$ Point for each 150 Points submitted.
Contacts $=1$ Contact per member 1 time only.
MONTHLY SPECIALS: Each Month there will be 3 Special People. Collect their Special for +5 pts each, or 25 pts for all worked for the month.
\#1. Trophy Girl
\#2. Pole Position
\#3. Mystery Driver
The only Speedway Chapter "SPECIAL EVENT" will be 1 each year in November for the Yearly Season's Point Championships. Full details will be released each year in September \& October. Those who participate in the Special Event, and who are Paid Up 10-X Dues Members will receive the $5 \times 9$ AWARD \& Certificate. $5 \times 9$ AWARD Numbers will be collectable for 1 point each one time. To submit $5 \times 9$ Award points you must hold the $5 \times 9$ AWARD status, yet
all should collect them so they can be submitted when $5 \times 9$ AWARD status is achieved, so they are retroactive. Speedway Chapter Nets: Chapter Nets will be held on 3rd Thursday of each month at 18:00 UTC on 28.350 MHz . With good enough propagation more nets might become possible on an interest basis? As the ARRL Ten Meter contest has just completed for 2009, I hope everyone made a few hundred contacts and had a good time. The contest was uneventful until Sunday about 1730 UTC when the band opened up for stateside contacts and we started to make 100+ QSO's per hour. It was a great run for the rest of the day and I finished with 350 SSB and about 50 CW contacts. The DX was absent except for a few South American contacts. During the CQWW DX contest, the Ten meter band was barely open into South America and the Caribbean for DX contacts.
Solar Cycle 24 produced a few new spots recently that has helped propagation. I hope the winter DX season will improve as we move into 2010, but a low solar flux number is making for tough times on Ten! A solar flux of 85 is needed for the USA to hear Europe on a regular basis- so good luck this winter.

A6 United Arab Emirates has been making foreign operator's licensing more accessible. A 2008 meeting of the Emirates Amateur Radio Society, has led to licensing changes. Gerry VE6LB \#24329, worked with Michel A65BM, and with the EARS hams, who helped him apply for his license to operate in 2010. He will operate January 8 to February 8, 2010, from his daughter's home in Dubai, using CW with 100 watts to a wire antenna signing A6/ VE6LB. QSL to his home call or LoTW.
Countries Award: The number of basic certificates issued remains at 622 . I had one upgrade this past quarter by Ken G3XPO \#70614 for 135 Countries. 6W Senegal. Sebastien F8IJV \#64604, was on his honeymoon in Senegal from October $15-30^{\text {th }}$. He was in the CQ WW SSB Contest as 6V7Q.

7Q Malawi. Ely IN3VZE \#31856, used the call sign 7Q7CE from October $3^{\text {rd }}$ for two weeks using only SSB and focused on working RTTY to the USA.

Propagation: Propagation continues to be poor as the new Cycle 24 sun spots are few and far between. We have seen weeks of no sun spots in 2009 as this trend continues. Expect the daily solar flux to range from 70-75 the next quarter and the monthly flux will stay below 80 until solar Cycle 24 is made official by NOAA.
On December $15^{\text {th }}$ the solar flux was 82 the $A$ index 1 and $K$ index 1. No storms expected. Expect the best conditions on December 14-17 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, January 10-12 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, February 5-8th, and March $5-7^{\text {th }}$. Over the next four months, for USA stations, expect a $10 \%$ chance of DX in the mornings to Asia, Europe or Africa and a $25 \%$ chance into South America or the Pacific in the pm. To tell what DX paths are open, listen for the beacons from 28.175-28.300 (especially 28.200 ).

## Meet Your Director Jack Moore, K5CC, \#50708

My interest in amateur radio started from listening to stories from my great uncle Virt Elmore. He built a spark gap station in 1915 and received his license in 1916 as 9BA. The Government took his transmitter at the start of WW1. He never got back on the air after the war. After I got my license I helped him get his in 1952 as W9BB. We worked each other on CW until his death. He never got
 on phone. I have his old radio papers.
I received my license in 1950 as W9LZT in Illinois. I built up a power supply for a ARC5 aircraft transmitter on 40 meters. I used this for 6 years. Television interference was a big problem as I would wipe out TV for several blocks around. In 1956 Barbara and I went to Germany for a tour that lasted 5 Years. I obtained the German call DL4CP. I built up a Heath DX35 and Heath Apache. The late 1950s were the best sunspot cycle on record. It was common to have ten meters open 24 hours a day. In terms of getting on the air and making contacts it was the most productive time of my amateur career.
In 1961 we moved to Seattle where I became K7QPT. I traveled a lot so ham radio was second fiddle to travel and family matters. I made a lot of Japanese contacts and got to visit several hams on my trips to Alaska.

In 1964 we moved to northern Virginia where we spent an enjoyable 14 years. I had three calls during this period WA4VXE, K4ASJ and K4NF. I obtained my Extra class license in 1968 by going to the FCC Headquarters in Washington DC and taking the written and 20 words per minute CW exam. It was an intimidating experience. I worked Barry Goldwater several times on 2 meters in the Washington area. For most of the time I used a Swan 350 transceiver. Barbara and I earned our pilots licenses and bought a Cessna four place airplane. I mounted two and ten meter antennas on the plane and had a great deal of fun while Barbara was doing the flying I could play ham radio. The ten meter antenna wasn't all that efficient but I made a number of contacts. Two meters was fun but I had to stay off repeaters since I brought up stations up and down the northeast.

We moved to San Antonio in 1978 looking to retire in the area. I retired in 1978 and we moved to a house we built in the hill country on 22 acres. For the first time I could put up decent antennas. I first became interested in 10-10 after checking into the South Texas Lighthorse Brigade chapter net. After checking into local nets for a year I decided to ask members up for a picnic at my place. This started a run that lasted 20 years. Over the years members showed up from all over the country, Canada and England. I think everyone had a good time and only age caused Barbara and me to call it quits. In 2001 I was asked to become trustee of W6OI, the 10-10 International club station. This has been an enjoyable experience. In 2004 I became a member of the 10-10 Board of Directors and will complete my service on the Board at the end of 2010. For the first four years I had responsibility for the 10-10 internet activities and now have responsibility for the QSO Party program.

I will complete 59 years in ham radio later this year. I have enjoyed every year. This will be my 6th sunspot cycle and look forward to working as many members as I can. Ten-Ten has been my main interest in ham radio the past 20 years. It has been a labor of love.

## Election 2010 <br> CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Nominations must be sent to the Nomination Committee prior to May 1, 2010.

The Nominating Committee develops a slate of eligible candidates by June 1, 2010. The chairman of the committee will provide each potential nominee with information regarding eligibility and specifying the information required by the committee. The chairman of the committee will notify members selected by the Nominating Committee, in writing. Members not selected by the committee may petition for candidacy by having a petition signed by 50 full members and presented to the Secretary by July 1 , 2010. A nomination information form is required and is available from the Nominations Committee Chairperson. Further questions concerning the election/nomination process may be addressed to Rob Ireland, VE9KM, Nominations Committee Chair, 31 St. James St. Sackville, NB, E4L 4L7, Canada; or via e-mail to rireland@mta.ca.

## Qualification for Nomination to be an Officer or Director of 10-10

In accord with the bylaws, no member of 10-10 may qualify for nomination to be an Officer or Director of 10-10 unless he or she has been a full member for more than four (4) years immediately preceding his/her Nomination, and that he/she can show that their membership will remain current during the period of the office they are seeking. The Nominating Committee or Petition for Candidacy are the only methods to be used by members who wish to be nominated.

## Selection by the Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee is charged with the task of selecting from those who indicate a desire or willingness to serve as an Officer or Director and to form a slate of candidates who the committee believes represent the best qualified candidates from information submitted to the Committee.

## Petition for Candidacy

Members and nominees not selected by the nominating committee may petition for candidacy. Such petitions shall be signed by 50 full members and submitted to the Secretary by July 1, 2010.

## Biographical Sketch

All Candidates, whether selected by the Nominating Committee or by Petition, must submit a biographical information form and biographical sketch. The Nominating Committee will use this information in the process of selecting a slate of Candidates. Those who petition for nomination must submit a biographical information form to be provided by and returned to the Secretary. This biographical outline, not to exceed 200 words of narrative, shall be printed in the July 2010 issue of the 10-10 News.

## Notification of Potential Nominees

The chair of the Nominating Committee shall notify members selected by the Nominating Committee to be candidates in writing. The chair of the Nominating Committee shall also notify, in writing on or before June 1, 2010, members who are not selected by the nominating committee, and inform them of the proper method of placing their names in nomination by petition.

6.2 10-10 QSO PARTIES

10-10 QSO Parties are events that are held for fun and to meet old, new and prospective members around the world. The rules listed here are for all general QSO parties The Anniversary, Meet the Volunteers, and Mobile QSO Parties are specialty events and do have additional rules.
6.2.1 WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs with operating privileges on the 10 meter band, however, logs will be accepted only from active members as of the date of the event with the following exception: Open Season event logs will be accepted from all amateurs. Other logs received will be handled as ckecklogs. Checklogs are used to validate (check) other logs but do not receive awards.
6.2.2 WHEN ARE THE QSO PARTIES?

There are currently eight QSO Parties held throughout the calendar year:
Winter Phone - held on the first full weekend in February
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Spring CW - held on the first full weekend in May.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Spring Digital - held on the first full weekend in May.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Open Season (PSK)-held on the first full weekend in June
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Summer Phone - held on the first full weekend in August.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
Sprint - a 24 hour event held on October 10th (10-10).
0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.
Fall CW - held on the last full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 Sunday.
Fall Digital - held on the last full weekend in October.
0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.
6.2.3 FREQUENCY AND MODES

Direct unassisted contacts only are permitted. Repeater, Satellite, IRPL or any other similar types of assisted contacts are NOT allowed. Based on the appropriate band plan for the country of operator, CW QSO Parties should be operated in the CW area of the 10 meter band and operated using CW only. Digital QSO Parties should be operated in the digital area of the 10 meter band and operated using Digital modes only (RTTY, PSK, etc). Phone QSO Parties must be operated in the PHONE area of the 10 meter band and may be operated using any approved method (SSB, FM, AM).
The SPRINT utilizes all operating modes in the 10 meter band.
NOTE: A QUIET ZONE between 28.490 and 28.510 shall be in effect during QSO Parties using the Phone portion of the 10 meter band to allow for others to use the band.
6.2.4 ENTRY CLASSIFICATION

Entrant may submit a log in ANY of the following classifications:
INDIVIDUAL: Includes single station operators and can also include OM/XYL teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers.
QRP: same as an individual as listed above except that output power does not exceed 5 watts with CW/Digital operations and/or 10 watts with Phone operations during the entire event.
CLUB: A Club must have a valid club station license issued by their National Licensing Authority and must have active 10-10 membership. Club entries must list the call, name, and 10-10 number (if any) for all operators using the club call. Club operations will take place at one location using one set of equipment.
6.2.5 TRANSMITTER INFORMATION

An operator may operate mobile, portable or fixed. If they change their exchange QTH during the QSO Party, the operator must show same in their log. The operator may enter a log from one call district, province, or DX country. Multi-transmitters (two or more transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) are NOT permitted in any QSO Party. If a single transmitter becomes inoperable, it is permissible to change to a replacement transmitter.

### 6.2.6 EXCHANGE

10-10 members send call sign, name, 10-10 \# and QTH (State, Province or Country). If received exchange does not have a 10-10\#, then record a zero(0) in the log. 6.2.7 QSO POINTS

Two (2) points are awarded for contacts WITH a 10-10 number. One (1) point is awarded for contacts WITHOUT a 10-10 number. Duplicate entries should be retained in log and show a zero (0) for points. Any log showing 10\% or more errors may be handled as a checklog. A station may be counted only once regardless of mode.
6.2.8 CHAPTER SCORE ASSIGNMENT

Any entrant who is a chapter member and whose operating location is within 150 miles of the primary net location of that charter, may assign the entrant's score to that chapter. QSO Party scores for the Sprint may not be assigned.

### 6.2.9 QSO PARTY ENTRIES

Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the $10-10$ web site. It is strongly suggested that logs be sent as soon as possible after the close of the event. It is also recommended that DX logs should be sent AIR Mail to insure they are received in good time. Any logs received with a postmark date AFTER the deadline date will be handled as a checklog. Any logs received more than 15 days after the entry deadline, regardless of postmark, will be discarded.
6.2.9.1 ENTRY DESCRIPTION

Entries must contain a Cover Sheet, Log and Dupe Sheet as described here:
COVER SHEET will list the Event Entered, Entry Classification, US Call Area (W0-W9
or DX Country), Chapter Score Assignment (if any), number of contacts and points with 10-10\#, number of contacts and points without 10-10\#, and total contacts and points claimed. LOGS must be listed in date/time order and list UTC Date, UTC Time, Call, Name, 10-10\# (zero (0) if none), QTH and Contact Point Value.
A DUPE SHEET is required for any logs exceeding 50 contacts. It may be either a list of all calls contacted in call sign order or hand entered on a dupe sheet grid.

### 6.2.9.3 ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for all QSO Parties listed EXCEPT the Sprint shall be postmarked no later than 15 calendar days (this will always be a Monday) after the close of the event. Mailed entries for the Sprint (held on 10/10) shall be postmarked no later than October 25th, unless that day falls on a Sunday, than the postmark deadline shall be October 26th. 6.2.10 QSO PARTY RESULTS AND AWARDS

QSO Party results will be posted on the 10-10 web site about 15 days after the closing deadline for the event and also printed in the 10-10 NEWS in the appropriate issue.
Awards will be issued by the certificate manager for Top Ten Individual scorers in the World, the top Individual scorer in each US Call Area (W0-W9), each DX Country, and for top QRP, CLUB and CHAPTER.
6.2.11 ANNIVERSARY QSO PARTY and MEET THE VOLUNTEERS

These events run from January 10001 UTC to December 312359 UTC.
In the Anniversary QSO Party, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members that have $10-10 \#$ anniversary year contained in their membership number. Example: 2010 is the 48th anniversary year of 10-10 International Net, Inc. Contact with members containing a " 48 " in their membership number (i.e., $72048,69485,64854$, $48126,00487)$ would count toward the event. Each year the anniversary number changes, making a new group of members the focus of the event and promoting the use of the 10 -meter band. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:
During the calendar year (January 1 through December 31) make legal 10-10 contacts with 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, QTH with members containing the anniversary year in their membership number as described above.
In the MEET THE VOLUNTEERS event, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members listed in the 10-10 NEWS as being a 10-10 volunteer. One contact per volunteer is permitted, regardless of mode of contact.
In both events, contacts must be made on the 10-meter band with any legal mode (AM, SSB, FM, PSK, CW, etc.).
All submitted logs must contain only one entry for each 10-10 number contacted. Contacts MUST be listed in 10-10 number order and each entry must list the 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, Name, QTH and Mode, in that order.
These events are for Individual entries as described in section 6.2.4 and certificates will be awarded for the TOP Ten, however all entrants will be listed in the 10-10 NEWS. Logs MUST be postmarked no later than January 15th of the year following both the Anniversary and Meet the Volunteers QSO Parties. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.
6.2.12 MOBILE QSO PARTY

This event is held on the third Saturday in March from 0001 to 2359 UTC. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:
Fixed stations contact mobiles. Mobiles contact everyone. Mobile applies to car, truck, RV, motorcycle, boat, airplane or other mode of transportation. If in doubt, contact the QSO Party Manager. A station operating a mobile entry must be a true mobile. Sitting in the driveway and using the base station antenna or amplifier, or using commercial power is not permitted. RV generators are permitted only if the generator is used while in transit (moving).
Operation while your vehicle is parked across a county line, occupying two counties, counts as two counties and two contacts. Marine and aeronautical mobiles must be able to establish counties of operation.
The on-the-air exchange shall be Call, Name, State, 10-10 Number (if member, zero (0) if not), and county (if applicable). Only counties in the 50 US states may be used as a multiplier.
Count one point for each contact whether a member or not. Fixed stations multiply the number of contacts by the number of different counties worked. Fixed Score equal number of contacts times number of counties worked. Mobile stations multiply the number of contacts by the number of different counties worked PLUS a bonus of the number of counties worked from. Score equals (number of contacts) times (counties worked plus counties worked from).
All mobile stations must submit separate logs for the counties worked from. Log scores will be combined by the QSO Party Manager. Here is an example of how scoring is done for each county worked from using the following numbers
Contacts made: 7: Counties worked: 5: Counties worked from: 3: Multiplier-Add counties worked and counties worked from ( $5+3=8$ ) Score for county: 7X8=56.
Do this computation for each county worked from. If scores from the other two counties worked were 64 an 90 then the total score would be $(56+94+90)=210$.
Logs MUST be postmarked no later than 14 days after the end of the event. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

4. You must remit dues for one or more years full membership. Fee schedule and payment information can be found in Section 2 below.

## TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

## Primary Membership

Primary membership is available with yearly dues, although there is a special incentive available when you pay for three years at once.

## Family Membership

Family membership consists of a primary member and one or more family members who qualify as a 10-10 member (has made the necessary 10 contacts) and who reside at the same location and postal address. Family memberships run concurrently with that of the primary member. Add $\$ 5.00$ for each additional family member for each year. Only the primary member will receive a copy of the 10-10 News.

## Life Membership

Life membership is available and may be paid in one lump sum or spread across two or three yeas. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

## Senior Life Membership
