From The President

Upper Level QRM

I would be remiss if I did not compliment all of the past Presidents for their dedicated service to this office. Ten-Ten has had a long and successful history of dedicated volunteers that gave their time, talent, and resources. This not only benefited the membership, but the Amateur Radio community as a whole. This has placed a heavy burden on me and I do request your support over my term in office. Looking back over the past 20 years of membership elected officials things have really changed. We all have noticed that membership participation in the election process has declined. Both the number of ballots submitted and the number of candidates requesting nomination have declined. In the first election in 1990, we had 26 nominated for the office of Director and 4,789 ballots were counted. In the election of 2010, we had 5 nominated for the office of Director and 326 ballots cast. These numbers just don't register well with over 4,500 current paid members. With these results, it is time that we make every effort to change the election process. In the past the Board of Directors has approved the electronic voting process. As soon as possible, work in this direction will begin as a priority. Wouldn't it be great to see a full ballot in future elections?

Iwould like to congratulate KM5EH Marcus Lieberman 71103, and KC4JD Jay Drew 57475 on their election to Director. They are tasked as replacements for K0DBK Brad Kimble 55192, and K5CC Jack Moore 50708. Both Brad and Jack were very active and served several terms as directors. Brad has recently retired from the US Military and wants to do what retired folks do. As for Jack at 81, he has decided to slow down just a bit. Of course they both will continue to serve. Brad will continue to serve as the Counties Award Manager and Jack will continue to serve as the trustee of W6OI Club Station. I have asked KM5EH to replace K0DBK and they are currently in the process of transition. Since Marcus is already an Awards Manager for the OM/XYY Award, he is familiar with the duties of this office. I have asked Jay to serve as the Director responsible for QSO Parties. Since Dan Morris KZ3T 41105 has served for several seasons as QSO Party Manager, he and K5CC can bring Jay up to date. If all goes well things there should be a smooth transition on the first of the year.

This, my first article to the News, is a bit unique. I am actually composing this article six weeks before I take office. Normally it would appear that all I could be doing is forecasting the future, but that is not the case. As the Internet Director, I have to locate and activate my replacement. After evaluating several prospects I decided to ask Jeff Steinkamp, N7YG 65084 to complete my term as Director in the area of Internet Services. At the time of this writing, Jeff is creating a vendors' page for the Ten-Ten site. This has been an area that needed attention for several years. There are several vendors that supply services and memorabilia to the membership. Some of these do so at a discounted price and some return a percentage of the profit from these sales back to Ten-Ten. As an organization we cannot endorse any of these products or services, that is up to the consumer. We can however give them acknowledgment in the form of ad space.

Two areas that have always been of importance to me are the Ten-Ten web site and the membership data. Over the past two years a lot of effort has been made to bond these together. With online membership applications, renewals, and updates, the data can be processed quicker and more efficiently. With the online shopping cart the process has been streamlined. The Data Manager and Internet Director are currently making progress to make the check-out process a bit easier to the member and with less effort in processing. In 1993 when Gerry WA6POZ 21274 became Data Manager, things began to move forward. Previously membership was handled by area managers with blocks of numbers to issue. This process was cumbersome and very hard to monitor. Central data processing has always proven its worth. Of course moving the 30 years worth of data off of magnetic tape and into a computer based data format was a task in itself. One can only imagine the time involved it this with 40,000 plus members. Of course there were missed numbers and mistakes with all the different parties involved, but now you can use the online look up and in a few seconds view a member's status. One of my

personal goals is to see the portability of the data which allows the membership to use it in personal database applications. Some data will continue to be restricted due to privacy concerns and regulations.

On the matter of the Ten -Ten Website, as a retired Internet Provider I am keenly aware of the issues involved. Security is of course the number one priority, with three applications, 6 databases and 840 megs of data. Our past Presidents have always realized what the web site means to the organization. Our net control stations inform prospects that this is where information about 10-10 can be found. Every member is encouraged to browse the site thoroughly and help the Internet Director keep the information accurate and current. Considering that most of the pages have existed for many years, there could be inaccurate data and or bad links. It took over six weeks to convert the pages to what they are now and very little time was allowed to verify all of the content. The web site is what the world sees when it looks for Ten-Ten. Every effort has been made to secure the applications and this work will continue. I do encourage the membership to use the Forum and the Chat Room since they are there for you.

Ten-Ten on the social network, well to me this is an oxymoron-type situation. I consider Amateur Radio as the father of social networking. This is what we have been doing since the first contact was made. I consider telecommunications as one of the major causes for the decline in amateur radio. How many of us have handy talkies going to waste, but have the latest and greatest cell phones? Members do have non-official sites on both Facebook and Twitter. Hopefully when the solar cycle favors us again, members will decide it is time to get on the air and not on the internet.

Mygoal as your President is to make every effort possible to publicize Ten-Ten on the air, and encourage members to do the same. I also plan to attend Dayton, Ham-Com, and the St. Louis Convention this year. Hopefully during this time when the band is blessed with solar activity, Ten-Ten can grow to the point that is considered one of the major factions with Amateur Radio. I encourage each member to share this goal with me.

God Bless & 73 Mel KD5DE #33513 **Notice: Changes to Credit Card Processing** In late November changes were made in the way Credit Card transactions were being processed. These changes were necessary to streamline the process and to conform to the latest requirements of the Payment Card Industry (PCI). This is not to say that the previous way was either illegal or wrong. They were not and could have continued. But it was felt that the time was right to make the process more secure and meet the most current requirement regarding security of cardholder information.

10-10 has entered into an agreement with Pay Pal to have them be a gateway to process credit cards. If you have a Pay Pal account you can use that account to process your membership dues. Or you can use your VISA, MasterCard, Discover Card or American Express card and still process using Pay Pal.

The effort will be to immediately process the credit card and then upon approval of that transaction the Data Manager will process the renewal or membership request. If any errors are made in the credit card process the Data Manage or Treasurer can have Pay Pal correct the transaction.

A second change will be made effective February 1, 2011. Credit card requests received via the postal system will no longer be accepted, the member will be contacted and the mailed request will be destroyed. 10-10 has been processing credit card payments for over 10 years and we know of no case where card information was illegally obtained and used to commit fraud. However, it was felt that a secure on-line processing system in today's world is far more safe and secure.

Notice: Change to the Electronic Distribution of the 10-10 NEWS

Effective with the April issue of the 10-10 NEWS, the distribution of the electronic edition of the 10-10 NEWS will only be done by sending an email with instructions on how to download a copy from the 10-10 web. An email with the 10-10 NEWS attached will no longer be an option. With the addition of more color and pictures the size of the electronic copy has increased to the point where some Internet Service Providers are rejecting the email. If you are currently receiving the 10-10 NEWS via an attachment to an email the change will be automatically made. If you wish to opt out of receiving an electronic copy, send a request to the Data Manager. And if you wish to start receiving it electrically send that request also to the Data Manager.

We have had to QRT two chapters during the last reporting period. They were the City of Melbourne and the Pine State. I don't think that there is anyway that the records of those chapters can be obtained. If you don't want your chapter to become a QRT one, then have your records ready to pass on to someone else. With the change of rules to delete the requirement for a chapter's members to be within ground-wave distance, a chapter can be taken over by someone outside that distance. As an example, I took over as the CM for the Space Coast Chapter so that it would not become QRT. A few chapter numbers and a few seal numbers were lost but, primarily, the chapter records were satisfactorily recompiled. If your records can be entered on a flash drive, then drop a copy to me and I will maintain a chapter library.

On October 10, 2010, the **Netherlands Antilles** were broken up into four new countries. St. Maarten and Curaçao each become an independent country and were granted the same status that Aruba attained in 1986.

Bonaire, Saba and Sint Eustatius were given the status of a public body and they are now directly under Dutch rule.

For Amateur Radio this means that the Leeward Islands (PJ2/PJ4) and Windward Islands (PJ5/PJ6/PJ7) are now deleted for ARRL DXCC and for 10-10. But, four new entities emerged as a result. St. Maarten (PJ7), Curacao (PJ2) and Bonaire (PJ4) become a new DXCC entity. St. Eustatius (PJ5) and Saba (PJ6) become a single DXCC entity due to their proximity to each other. All DXCC credits will be begin January 1, 2011 for 10-10 and ARRL. All of the new countries have been worked with 10-10 members since Oct 10th. So the 10-10 country count will increase by four and the count of worked 10-10 countries will increase to 319 in 2011. About twenty-nine Countries remaining to be worked for a new 10-10 entity.

QSO PARTY LOGS

Most of the QSO Party logs I get are in numerous forms. Manual logs still dominate with WIN1010 and N3FJP type logs following close behind. The manual logs I get are in text format, PDF's, Jpeg's, Excel, Word and, of course, numerous members use the Cover Sheet and Log forms from the TenTen web site, you name it and it has been submitted. The majority of the logs that are emailed are in the Cabrillo format which is preferred but I also get varying forms of logs in text, Word, Excel, etc. I do accept most any form via email with the exception of two: adif and Q95. There are a number of contest programs out there and it would be nice to get as many of those submitting manual logs to submit logs via email. I understand there are circumstances where several people are unable to submit via email and that is fine. By all means continue submitting logs via USPS. For those that wish to submit QSO Party logs via email that have not before, the email address is: tentencontest@roadrunner.com.

There are a number of 10-10 QSO Party logging software out there. Some of the programs available are WIN1010, N3FJP Ten Ten 2.5, TenxLogger, GenLog32, N1MM Logger to name a few. There are several other programs that members use but I am not familiar with those. The ones I have mentioned all provide a cover sheet, log and/or dupe sheet.

WIN1010 will do all of the 10-10 QSO Parties and has all of the bells & whistles if you are in to paper chasing and seeking the different awards available to active 10-10 members. You are able to submit a Cabrillo or ASCII log with this program. K4HAV, Jim is the author and anyone can contact him for info on this program. There is a cost for this program.

N3FJP Ten Ten 2.5 10-10 QSO Party software is very good also. You can purchase this software from Scott's web site. It does not do all of the 10-10 QSO Parties but it does create a Cabrillo log for submission.

N1MM Logger I am not as familiar with but I believe it to be a pretty good program.

GenLog is a good all around contest software program. It has some of the 10-10 QSO Parties and many other general contests. It does provide a Cabrillo log as well.

TenxLogger has been revised and is now available. N7YG, Jeff is the author and it is a very simple and basic program. This program will do all of the 10-10 QSO Parties and does create a Cabrillo log also. If simple and easy is what you want then you may want to try this one.

N1MM, GenLog and TenxLogger are all free programs. All of the above mentioned programs are very good. You can go from a very basic, simple logging software such as TenxLogger to the bells & whistles of WIN1010. If you are thinking about switching software or going from manual logging and not sure which one you want, download some and try them out. I have used all of them and am pretty familiar with them except for N1MM Logger.

I am not trying to discourage anyone from submitting manual

logs. If you do not have a computer or email, by all means submit your logs via USPS. I am just trying to throw out some additional options for members to choose from.

I am not endorsing any particular program. It all boils down to how comfortable you feel with using logging software, how involved you want to get in 10-10, paper chasing and QSO Parties. The main thing is to try some, play with the programs, go with one or two you like and, most of all, HAVE FUN!!

Early Amateur Operator – Great Uncle of Jack K5CC #50708

This is the story of Virt Elmore, early radio operator in Williamson County IL. Virt was born in Union County in 1887 and died in Marion in 1969. Virt spent over 55 years with the Illinois Central Radio as a telegraph operator, agent and finished as Station Manager In Marion. In Marion he lived at 615 N. Madison and later at 1404 N. Glendale. In 1915 Virt become interested in the new medium of radio and built what is probably the first transmitter in Williamson County. It was a spark transmitter using a KW Thordasen transformer. Coils were made out of oatmeal boxes and the receiver was a galena crystal with a catwhisker for tuning. The antenna was four wires 75 feet long on masts 45 feet in the air. Virt occasionally had local school children over to demonstrate the equipment. When the spark was generated by the key there was a flash like lighting and a very loud noise which scared the children. Virt communicated with other radio amateurs around the area and Midwest. Originally he used his initials VRE as his call sign but in Jan 1916 he was issued the call sign 9BA by The Department of Commerce Radio Inspector in Cleveland Ohio. He continued to communicate with other amateur operators until the start of World War 1. At that time all transmitting equipment was required to be sent to the Government and Virt's equipment was sent to Ft Dodge Iowa where it was used to train military personnel. His equipment was returned in 1919 but by then the state of the art had progressed beyond Virt's home built equipment and he never got back into amateur radio until 1952 when his nephew Jack Moore (who was a licensed operator) helped Virt get a license and renew the hobby. From that date Virt was active until his death. He operated only Morse Code (no voice) and talked to amateurs over the world including his nephew with weekly schedules while stationed in Germany. All of Virt's early papers, including copies of licenses, diagrams of equipment, numerous letters, and signal reports have been digitized and are available online at http://www. wd8das.net/9BA.



Tips when submitting Bar Applications in Excel

I get many different formats when members submit for bar applications. For those that submit with logging software like WIN1010 and others that check for duplicate 10-10 numbers I thank you. That makes my job a bit easier. It would be impossible for me to try and cover all the various formats used and there is no real way to guard against getting a few duplicates in any of the bar applications. I can give a tip or two for those that do submit bar applications using a spreadsheet such as Excel. It is very easy to check for duplicates. I'm not sure about OpenOffice Calc. I believe there is a way but I have not found that out as of yet. Maybe someone out there already knows and if so, please let me know so I can pass it on to others.

For those that submit bar applications using Excel 2003 here is what you do:

You have your columns set up with all the appropriate data and let's say your 10-10 numbers begin with cell B4. Select cell B4. On the FORMAT menu select Conditional Formatting. The first box should contain the text 'Cell Value is'. Click on the drop down arrow and choose FORMULA IS. The dialog box should change appearance to a formula box. Enter the following formula: =COUNTIF(B:B,B4) > 1. Now click the Format Button, click the Patterns tab and click a bright color that will stand out. Click OK and then OK again. Now, with cell B4 highlighted click COPY from the edit menu, Press CTRL + Spacebar to select the entire column. Click Paste Special on the Edit menu and then choose Formats and submit them. Skip a line and start on your next 100 numbers and submit them, etc. If you have a duplicate in any subsequent groups of 100, as soon as you enter the 10-10 number and hit the tab key that cell should show up with the highlight color you chose. Now, all you have to do is double check the one it is duplicating and fix it.

For those that submit bar applications using Excel 2007 here is what you do:

Highlight the column that has the 10-10 numbers. It does not matter what is in the cells in that column above where your 10-10 numbers start. At the Home Tab go across and click on Conditional formatting. Go to the first choice 'Highlight Cell rules' and then click on Duplicate values at the bottom. Then choose a highlight color. That is all there is to it for Excel 2007.

Now, if you want to keep track of how many 10-10 numbers you have submitted (although that should be evident by how many different groups of 100 you have listed), this is a quick look at what you have right at the top of your spreadsheet. I believe this will work for Excel 2003 and 2007. Choose an empty cell somewhere at the top of your spreadsheet and enter the following formula using the example above that your 10-10 numbers are in column B: =COUNT(B4:B5000)

You can change that 5000 to 10000 or any number you like. This will keep track of all the 10-10 numbers you have submitted. I hope this information has helped and for those of you that have Excel and not using this medium will give you another option to use if it is better than what you are using now. If you have any questions, please let me know. Thank you

TEN-TEN QSO PARTY RULES

6.2 10-10 **QSO PARTIES**

10-10 QSO Parties are events that are held for fun and to meet old, new and prospective members around the world. The rules listed here are for all general QSO parties The Anniversary, Meet the Volunteers, and Mobile QSO Parties are specialty events and do have additional rules.

6.2.1 WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs with operating privileges on the 10 meter band, however, logs will be accepted only from active members as of the date of the event with the following exception: Open Season event logs will be accepted from all amateurs. Other logs received will be handled as ckecklogs. Checklogs are used to validate (check) other logs but do not receive awards.

6.2.2 WHEN ARE THE QSO PARTIES?

There are currently ten QSO Parties held throughout the calendar year:

Winter Phone - held on the first full weekend in February 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Mobile - Held on the 3rd Saturday in March

0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.

Spring Digital - held on the last full weekend in April. 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Spring CW - held on the first full weekend in May.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Open Season (PSK) - held on the first full weekend in June 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Sprit of 76 - 7 day, 6 mode event centering around 4 July each year

Summer Phone - held on the first full weekend in August. 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Sprint - a 24 hour event held on October 10th (10-10). 0001 UTC through 2359 UTC.

Fall CW - held on the 3rd full weekend in October. 0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

Fall Digital - held on the 2nd full weekend in October.

0001 UTC Saturday through 2359 UTC Sunday.

6.2.3 FREQUENCY AND MODES

Direct unassisted contacts only are permitted. Repeater, Satellite, IRPL or any other similar types of assisted contacts are NOT allowed. Based on the appropriate band plan for the country of operator, CW QSO Parties should be operated in the CW area of the 10 meter band and operated using CW only. Digital QSO Parties should be operated in the digital area of the 10 meter band and operated using Digital modes only (RTTY, PSK, etc). Phone QSO Parties must be operated in the PHONE area of the 10 meter band and may be operated using any approved method (SSB, FM, AM).

The SPRINT utilizes all operating modes in the 10 meter band.

NOTE: A QUIET ZONE between 28.490 and 28.510 shall be in effect during QSO Parties using the Phone portion of the 10 meter band to allow for others to use the band. 6.2.4 ENTRY CLASSIFICATION

Entrant may submit a log in ANY of the following

classifications:

INDIVIDUAL: Includes single station operators and can also include OM/XYL teams or any families or groups of people using individual call signs and 10-10 numbers.

QRP: same as an individual as listed above except that output power does not exceed 5 watts with CW/Digital operations and/ or 10 watts with Phone operations during the entire event.

CLUB: A Club must have a valid club station license issued by their National Licensing Authority and must have active 10-10 membership. Club entries must list the call, name, and 10-10 number (if any) for all operators using the club call. Club operations will take place at one location using one set of equipment.

6.2.5 TRANSMITTER INFORMATION

An operator may operate mobile, portable or fixed. If they change their exchange QTH during the QSO Party, the operator must show same in their log. The operator may enter a log from one call district, province, or DX country. Multi-transmitters (two or more transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) are NOT permitted in any QSO Party. If a single transmitter becomes inoperable, it is permissible to change to a replacement transmitter.

6.2.6 EXCHANGE

10-10 members send call sign, name, 10-10 # and QTH (State, Province or Country). If received exchange does not have a 10-10#, then record a zero(0) in the log.

6.2.7 QSO POINTS

Two (2) points are awarded for contacts WITH a 10-10 number. One (1) point is awarded for contacts WITHOUT a 10-10 number. Duplicate entries should be retained in log and show a zero (0) for points. Any log showing 10% or more errors may be handled as a checklog. A station may be counted only once regardless of mode.

6.2.8 CHAPTER SCORE ASSIGNMENT

Any entrant who is a chapter member and whose operating location is within 150 miles of the primary net location of that charter, may assign the entrant's score to that chapter. QSO Party scores for the Sprint may not be assigned.

6.2.9 QSO PARTY ENTRIES

Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager as identified in the 10-10 NEWS or on the 10-10 web site. It is strongly suggested that logs be sent as soon as possible after the close of the event. It is also recommended that DX logs should be sent AIR Mail to insure they are received in good time. Any logs received with a postmark date AFTER the deadline date will be handled as a checklog. Any logs received more than 15 days after the entry deadline, regardless of postmark, will be discarded. All logs may be sent via Email. Please no .Q95 or .adif files.

6.2.9.1 ENTRY DESCRIPTION

Entries must contain a Cover Sheet, Log and Dupe Sheet as described here:

COVER SHEET will list the Event Entered, Entry Classification, US Call Area (W0-W9

or DX Country), Chapter Score Assignment (if any), number of contacts and points with 10-10#, number of contacts and points without 10-10#, and total contacts and points claimed. LOGS must be listed in date/time order and list UTC Date, UTC Time, Call, Name, 10-10# (zero (0) if none), QTH and Contact Point Value.

A DUPE SHEET is required for any logs exceeding 50 contacts. It may be either a list of all calls contacted in call sign order or hand entered on a dupe sheet grid.

6.2.9.3 ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for all QSO Parties listed EXCEPT the Sprint shall be postmarked no later than 15 calendar days (this will always be a Monday) after the close of the event. Mailed entries for the Sprint (held on 10/10) shall be postmarked no later than October 25th, unless that day falls on a Sunday, than the postmark deadline shall be October 26th.

6.2.10 QSO PARTY RESULTS AND AWARDS

QSO Party results will be posted on the 10-10 web site about 15 days after the closing deadline for the event and also printed in the 10-10 NEWS in the appropriate issue.

Awards will be issued by the certificate manager for Top Ten Individual scorers in the World, the top Individual scorer in each US Call Area (W0-W9), each DX Country, and for top QRP, CLUB and CHAPTER. Electronic certificates will be sent to the 2nd and 3rd place scorers in these categories.

6.2.11 ANNIVERSARY QSO PARTY and MEET THE VOLUNTEERS

These events run from January 1 0001 UTC to December 31 2359 UTC.

In the Anniversary QSO Party, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members that have 10-10# anniversary year contained in their membership number.

Example: 2011 is the 49th anniversary year of 10-10 International Net, Inc. Contact with members containing a "49" in their membership number (i.e.,72048, 69485,64854, 48126, 00487) would count toward the event. Each year the anniversary number changes, making a new group of members the focus of the event and promoting the use of the 10-meter band. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

During the calendar year (January 1 through December 31) make legal 10-10 contacts with 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, QTH with members containing the anniversary year in their membership number as described above.

In the MEET THE VOLUNTEERS event, entrants may submit a log of contacts with members listed in the 10-10 NEWS as being a 10-10 volunteer. One contact per volunteer is permitted, regardless of mode of contact.

In both events, contacts must be made on the 10-meter band with any legal mode (AM, SSB, FM, PSK, CW, etc.).

All submitted logs must contain only one entry for each 10-10 number contacted. Contacts MUST be listed in 10-10 number order and each entry must list the 10-10 Number, Date, Call Sign, Name, QTH and Mode, in that order.

These events are for Individual entries as described in section 6.2.4 and certificates will be awarded for the TOP Ten, however all entrants will be listed in the 10-10 NEWS. Logs MUST be postmarked no later than January 15th of the year following both the Anniversary and Meet the Volunteers QSO Parties. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are allowed to submit logs.

This event is held on the third Saturday in March from 0001 to 2359 UTC. All general rules are applicable with the following exceptions:

This is a mobile QSO Party, therefore only mobile stations will submit logs, however, fixed stations are encouraged to participate to help give out points and collect counties. Mobile applies to car, truck, RV, motorcycle, boat, airplane or other mode of transportation. If in doubt, contact the QSO Party Manager. A station operating a mobile entry must be a true mobile. Sitting in the driveway and using the base station antenna or amplifier, or using commercial power is not permitted. RV generators are permitted only if the generator is used while in transit (moving).

Operation while your vehicle is parked across a county line, occupying two counties, counts as two counties and two contacts. Marine and aeronautical mobiles must be able to establish counties of operation. Safety is paramount while operating mobile. If you are unable to park near multiple county lines due to safety issues (i.e. on a bridge, on a freeway, etc.), please move to the closest area which would provide the best operating conditions and still be able to give out multiple counties.

The on-the-air exchange shall be Call, Name, QTH, 10-10 Number (if available) and County. Scoring will be the same as other 10-10 QSO Parties. 2 points awarded for contacts with a 10-10# and 1 point awarded for contacts without a 10-10#. Duplicate entries are allowed when working in multiple counties. (i.e. if K4HAV is a on 3 county line and he works K4JPC, That would count as 3 contacts, one for each County).

Logs must be in date/time order and list Date, UTC time, County worked from (If applicable), Call, Name, 10-10# (zero 0 if none), County Worked, QTH and Contact Point Value. Fixed stations may submit logs as check logs only.

Logs MUST be postmarked no later than 14 days after the end of the event. Only members in good standing (with dues paid) are eligible for awards.

6.2.13 SPIRIT OF 76 (7 Days, 6 Modes) QSO PARTY

This event will run for 7 days and be around July 4th of each year. Make as many contacts as you can during the week using 6 modes. The modes that will be used are as follows as well as the **suggested** frequencies to monitor:

- 1. USB (28.345) 2. RTTY (28.086) 3. CW (28.050)
- 4. FM (29.600) 5. PSK (28.120) 6. AM (29.000)

Scoring will be as normal for QSO Parties, 2 points for members and 1 point for non-members. Dupes will be allowed once for each mode. It will be possible to work the same call 6 times in each of the various modes for a maximum total of 12 points per call. All other normal rules apply. Logs shall be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

6.2.14 FOR MORE INFORMATION

Current information about 10-10 and upcoming 10-10 QSO Parties is always available on the 10-10 web site. Cover sheets, logging forms and dupe sheets are also available for downloading or printing. The address is http://www.ten-ten. org. Any unanswered questions regarding the QSO Party rules may be forwarded to the QSO Party Manager.

Here is what you need:

1. You must hold a valid amateur operator license.

2. Your valid amateur operator license MUST authorize or qualify you for unsupervised transmitting operations in the ten meter amateur band under your own personal call sign.

3. You must make contact with ten members of 10-10 on ten meters and submit a log listing all contacts, their 10-10 number, call sign, name, date of contact, and QTH (state/province/country). A new member application and contact log is available in Section 1 below.

4. You must remit dues for one or more years full membership. Fee schedule and payment information can be found in Section 2 below.

TYPES OF MEMBERSHIPS

Primary Membership

Primary membership is available with yearly dues, although there is a special incentive available when you pay for three years at once.

Family Membership

Family membership consists of a primary member and one or more family members who qualify as a 10-10 member (has made the necessary 10 contacts) and who reside at the same location and postal address. Family memberships run concurrently with that of the primary member. Add \$5.00 for each additional family member for each year. Only the primary member will receive a copy of the 10-10 News.

Life Membership

Life membership is available and may be paid in one lump sum or spread across two or three yeas. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Senior Life Membership

Senior life membership is available to anyone who is currently 65 years of age or older. Payment can be made as one lump sum or within a one year period. For information refer to the "Life Membership Application" form on the web or contact the 10-10 Data Manager.

Family Life Membership is no longer available

Club Membership

Club Membership is available to any Amateur Radio Organization which holds a valid Amateur Radio License. Application must be made by the club trustee. No Family or Life Memberships are available. Membership is available with or without the 10-10 NEWS.

WinIQ

WinIQ is a Windows based program that is updated monthly and is a cross reference between the call and 10-10 number. It can be found on the 10-10 web.

XXIP

XXIP is a DOS based program that is updated monthly and is a roster of 10-10 membership through 10-10 #75001. It is available free at www.ten-ten.org/xxip.

AN-TEN-TEN-NAS
