## Words from the President

### GIVE 'BM THE BAD NEWS FIRST

During this high— and low-level political year, the air is full of predictions and promises. As I reported on these pages in the summer 10-10 News, the Annual Meeting of 10-10 members will be held on November 2, 1980, and its first order of business will be the election of officers for the two-year period beginning on January 1, 1981. I also indicated that amendments to the By-laws would be considered at that time, and asked that any of you who wish to propose any send such proposals to me, so that they might be considered, and possibly included. I have received none. However, I do expect to have some of my own, and therein lie my predictions and promises.

Regardless of who the officers may be for the next term, there are certain facts that must be faced, and those facts have mainly to do with the ever-rising costs of operation. As I have mentioned before, 10-10's two chief items of expense are printing and postage, with the costs involved in our mailing service running very close behind these two. Elsewhere in this issue, you will find a "Statement of Revenue and Expense," which was prepared from data supplied by Treasurer Joe Plumb.

If you look at the last line on that statement, you will see the figure that causes me most concern. For the 1979 - 1980 fiscal year, ending March 31, 1980, 10-10 took in just \$878 more than we spent. That amount is so marginal, especially when you consider that it costs 10-10 something over \$5,000 to get out each issue of the News, that it just plain scares me!

All of that leads me now to my prediction and my promise. The prediction is this: unless we take steps to increase 10-10's income, and, if possible, decrease the expenses, we'll simply have to omit an issue of the 10-10 News during 1981 or 1982. The promise is this: I shall ask the Annual Meeting for an increase in the annual dues.

A change in the amount of the annual dues involves a change in 10-10's By-laws. Article IV, Section B specifies the present \$3 amount, and is the one I shall ask to have changed. Although I have queried 10-10 Managers throughout the country on this matter, and have also submitted the problem to the Board of Directors, opinion as to the amount of increase is divided, with some believing that an increase to \$4 will be sufficient, while others think we should go to \$5. I have come to no conclusion on the matter, nor can I predict what the members will do in the meeting.

### FOREIGN MEMBERS

A matter closely allied to the whole matter of our dues structure is that of the dues to be required of foreign members. We have about 1250 foreign members, as I indicated on these pages in our last issue. That means the mailing, in a year's time, of 5000 copies of the 10-10 News. It costs 40¢ to mail each copy, surface rates, an annual expenditure of \$2000. To send the 5000 copies to members with U. S. addresses would cost \$420. If we put it on a per member basis, it costs 10-10 \$1.60 per year to mail the four copies of the News to foreign members, and just under 34¢ to mail them to domestic members. Since virtually all other 10-10 costs remain essentially the same, regardless of the member's place of residence, it is apparent that it costs 10-10 about \$1.25 more per year to serve a foreign member than one located in the U. S.

The problem is not unique to 10-10. If you examine the subscription costs to other ham magazines, you find that all have differential price structures. The size varies from magazine to magazine.

There is here again an ambivalence about the question of whether 10-10 should increase its dues for foreign members. Some feel strongly that U. S. members should continue to subsidize foreign members; others feel just as strongly that foreign members should, and would wish, to pay their own way. Again, I propose to submit to the Annual Meeting a recommendation that dues for foreign members be increased by 31 over those paid by U. S. members. How this will be received, or what action will be taken, I cannot predict.

## OVERSEAS AIRMAIL

There is another area in which 10-10 is taking a financial beating. Although the actual dollar numbers are not great now, they continue to increase and may present a serious problem in the future. That is the matter of airmailing the 10-10 News to members in other countries.

For some time, the Order Form which appears in each issue of the News has contained an offer to airmail the News to DX members for an additional annual fee of \$2.50. The "AO Mail" air rate is variable, depending on both distance and weight. The weight classification for the News is in the 2 - 4 ounce range. The closest members to which such mailing may go (Canada is excluded) require 76¢ postage, or \$3.04 per year, and those at the greatest distance require \$1.28 per issue, or \$5.12 per year.

Recently Roy Ackerman, W6DFM, who does such mailing, was ill, and I did this airmail for about 45 members, most of whom seemed to be at distances requiring more than the minimum rate. The average postage for those I mailed was around \$1.10, which, projected to an annual rate, becomes \$4.40, or a loss of \$1.90 per member. As I said back on the first lines of this section, the actual dollar loss is not great, and will not break 10-10. However, it is not a loss we can permit to grow.

I know of no easy, fool-proof solution to this problem, short of withdrawing the air rate entirely, and would certainly welcome suggestions on the matter.

## ILLNESSES AND REPLACEMENTS

I mentioned above that Roy Ackerman had been ill. Roy handles supplies for managers and officers, and does the foreign mailing. He had sent out most of the supplies before he gave up and went to the hospital, and the foreign mailing we had done elsewhere. Roy also handles the 10-10 International net on Friday, and volunteers carried that work on. Roy is home now, recovering, and back on the air.

Dick Rauscher, WEANK, who is 6th District Manager and NCS for the net on Monday and Wednesday, as well as doing many other things, also had a session in the hospital, came home on August 1, and is back on the air for the Monday net. We persuaded Dick to let someone else take it permanently on Wednesday, and the new man is Bob Holmes, WAENOP.

Both Roy and Dick have been doing 'iron man' acts, and the fact that both have had such heavy loads points up the need for more hands, especially here in the Los Angeles metropolitan area. If any members around here who don't attend the quarterly meetings, where they would hear me ask for volunteers, read this and would like to contribute some time and energy to 10-10, my telephone number is (213) 645-7205.

I have spent most of the foregoing two pages telling you why it seems likely we will have to increase 10-10's annual dues, as well as some other charges. There is one area in which I think we ask for money, but cannot demonstrate that the fee is there because of a need, and that is the 31.00 reinstatement

There is good reason for a \$1.00 registration fee. It represents the cost of entering all the information about the new member into the computer record, and otherwise making sure that he (or she) is a member in good standing. If, thereafter, that member changes call sign or address, the alteration is made at no charge. However, if he dares let his membership lapse by more than three months, we charge him an extra buck to renew, even though the cost to 10-10 is no greater than if he had renewed at the proper time.

I do not know the origin of this fee. I suspect it may have originated with the experiences of founding members with certain social or fraternal organizations; I know of no other amateur radio organization that has such a fee.

In any case, whatever the source of the fee, it seems to me to be unnecessary, and may even discourage members who have had a slight lapse in membership continuity from renewing. I shall ask for the deletion of this fee. Again, I have no idea whether my suggestion will be accepted, although, as always, (well, most of the time, anyhow) I am right!

Submitted By: Wm."Bill"Risher Awards Manager The sky was overcast and a very light fog obscured the view of distant objects; almost as if ordered for the scenario that was taking place: EARTH-QUAKE! EARTHQUAKE: 8.5 on the Richter Scale ... and many main arteries of Long Beach are rendered useless, making normal land approach to the Queen Mary Wireless Room an impossibility. How can radio communications get through with messages and important bulletins?

An exercise spearheaded by Jim Michaels, W6PGM, Assistant Emergency Coordinator, under the auspices of the Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES) and Community Amateur Radio Service (CARS) began on Saturday, July 19th at 0730 in the morning. Two organizations joined forces to see if their operation: SIERRA-ECHO-ECHO (Simulated Earthquake Emergency) ... . could do just that provide an important communication service for the community in time of need.

Providing boat transportation, two ham skippers from the Long Beach Power Squadron, Bill, W6EFR, aboard the "Horny Toad" and Jim, W6PGM, aboard the "Jimothy" set to work in the harbor, utilizing rubber inflatables, to pick up volunteer members of the Associated Radio Amateurs of Long Beach (ARALB). Acting on the previously arranged plan, and with the aid of mobile, maritime mobile and hand held rigs, amateur radio communications specialists were preparing to reach W6RO (Official ARRL Emergency Station) aboard the Queen Mary at Long Beach, California.

After a smooth ride to the bow of the Queen Mary, all disembarked and boarded the ship in whose wireless room they were met by the amateur operator on duty. However, in the event the landing pier had been destroyed, two "hams" had boarded a rubber raft, put overboard from the "Horny Toad", for an alternate landing on the rocks adjacent to the ship.

With the cooperation of several other hams in the local area at their field or home bases, the simulated disaster took place with the Queen Mary station as the emergency command post. SIERRA-ECHO-ECHO was a success!





10-10 International Net Winter QSO Party - 1981

by: Chuck Elliott, WSURK Chairman, Rules and Ethics Committee

STARTS: 00002 (UTC) Feb. 7, 1981 ENDS: 24002 (UTC) Feb. 8, 1981

QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only 10-10 members are eligible for awards. All contacts must be made on 10 meters. Modes acceptable are AM, SSB and FM. QSO Parties are not intended to demonstrate technical or contest endurance abilities, but to encourage interest in 10 meter operation. Members may submit 10-10 numbers collected for bar awards; non-members may use them to qualify for 10-10 membership.

#### BULES:

- t. Exchange call, city, state, name and 10-10 number
- 2. All station logs must be in UTC
- 3. A station may be counted only once
- 4. An operator may credit his/her score only to a local chapter of which he/she is a member. A local chapter is one that can be worked ground wave when the band is closed.
- 5. One may work any 24 hours of the 48 hours available. They need not be consecutive, but must be in a minimum of one-hour increments starting with the first contact. Any portion of a clock hour must be counted as a full hour. Example: you operate from 01302 to 02292. This counts as two hours of operation.

#### CLASSES OF OPERATION:

- 1. Single operator
- 2. QRP (20 watts PEP output SSB; 10 watts AM)

#### SCORING:

- 1. Each contact is worth one point
- Add an additional point if the station has a 10-10 number

#### AWARDS:

In each class, a first place certificate to each U.S. call area, KL7, KH5 and other U.S. Pacific islande, each VE district, Central America and the Caribbean, South America, Europe, Africa and South Atlantic, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific.

#### LOGS:

Logs are accepted from members only, and are due by March 7, 1981. Mail to Trotters & Pacers Chapter, in care of John M. Raczek, K2HLC, 22 Lake Ave., Batontown, N.J. 07724. Each entry on log must include call sign, date, time, QTH, Name, 10-10 number (if any). Submit a separate cover sheet showing your name, call, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter affiliation (if any), total hours of operation, total contacts and total number of points claimed. Logs not properly submitted may be rejected. Chapters submitting bulk mailings must divide them into two or more mailings, spaced several days apart.

Jim spends a lot of time on the certificate directory and it would be nice if the chapter head or certificate manager could send him a copy of your requirements and don't forget to do the same when you have an upgrade or any change. If you are into certificates at all you will want to send to Jim for the guide. The cost is \$3 and it is an invaluable tool for the one who is just beginning to collect certificates as well as those of us who have been at it for awhile. Jim is OK in the call book for several years. This is a private venture for Jim and is not a part of 10-10.

On many of the chapter reports it is noted that you have changed net time or the frequency. I would appreciate it if you would check with me before doing this because you might land on another net and I am sure that you would not want to do that. I do have a master listing of all the nets and their assigned frequencies so that I know if a frequency will be clear at a certain time and will be happy to check and to let you know. It really does little good to have me assign time and frequencies if you change them at will.

As long as we have chapters who issue certificates, we will continue to have some problems. I know that the mail fouls things up a lot but then there are some chapters who take an exceptionally long time to process an application. This, I know as is my job and all of us in 10-10, is a labor of love but it is unfair to have one wait for several weeks and hear nothing from an application and then follow up letters not be answered. Some chapters get on the air and start a certificate when they don't have it in hand and the time for having it is sometimes weeks or even months away. I feel that you should let an applicant know either by air or by mail that his application has been received, what his number is and and when to expect the certificate. The applicant has paid money and deserves to know when to expect his purchase.

We are deeply indebted to the LIARS chapter for the great job that they have done in tabulating the last few QSO parties. It is a big job and they have done it in re-

cord time for us. THANKS to ALL.

Speaking of the QSD party, the one comment in a negative tone was the 24 hour time limit. I don't like that rule either and I work longer than the 24 hours if I can because I am interested in collecting the new 10-10 numbers and for that reason I do not send a log in but we have a contest committee and it is their job to make the rules. If we don't like the rules, then when the request comes out for someone to work on the committee let your voice be heard to serve.

During the summer many of the chapters have had special activities to keep the group together and several continue to have monthly activities. Share your ideas with us. Some nets have had few check-ins while others have enjoyed much activity. It is you who keep the chapter going and who helps to keep 10-10 alive. We ask all of you to do your part in this.

I had such a nice letter from Dick Wightman, W878ZR telling me that the ORCA is extinct. I would like to share some of it with you; \*The ORCA will continue as a marine mobile club. 



## How to become a Ten-Ten Member

Work ten present members on 10 meters. Log each 10-10 number, call sign, date worked, operator's name, and location. Submit this list to your Call Sign Area Manager, with 51 Registration Fee and 33 for your first year's dues. Novices need not pay Registration Fee, and Novices and DX applicants need work but 5 present members. You will receive a Certificate and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the Quarterly 10-10 International News, and participate fully in 10-10 activities.

## How to earn Bars and Plaques

As a member, log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters. You may wish to mark your Roster to avoid duplicates, and to develop a filing system to record 10-10 contacts. All contacts must be bona-fide number exchanges on the air. When you have 100 contacts (including your first 10), list 100 only (never more, never less, and no duplicates) as follows:

- 1. Your list must be in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call sign, handle, location, and date worked.
- 2. You may submit only one list of 100 at a time.
- 3. You may not submit log books or copies of log book pages.
- 4. You must give your name, address, call sign, and 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.)
- 5. You must enclose an SASE (large size about 4  $1/4" \times 9 3/8"$ ).
- 6. Mail your materials to: Wm. (Bill) Risher, Jr., WB60MH 10542 Loch Avon Drive Whittier, CA 90606

When you have attained your 500 Bar, you will be assigned an Honorary V. P. Number, and will be entitled to participate in additional activities. In addition, plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, and 5,000 10-10 contacts.

## How to earn WAS

When you have worked at least one 10-10 member in each of the 50 states, and have QSL card confirmation, mail your cards to WB60FF (address above), and apply for the 10-10 WAS Certificate. Enclose also an alphabetic list of the states, with full information on each station worked, plus \$1.08 return postage.

## **Chapter Activities**

Many 10-10 chapters issue certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those chapters. See "A Guide to 10-10 Nets" for days and times when chapter nets meet. Groups wishing to create local chapters may get information from Chapter Coordinator Connie Hauck, K6EXQ, 794 W. 23 St., Upland, CA 91786.

## Is it That Time?

Look at the mailing label on this issue of your Quarterly Bulletin. In the center of the top line there is a four-digit number which tells you the expiration date of your Ten-Ten membership. The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your \$3.00 annual dues to your Call Area Mgr. If you are more than three months in arrears, you must pay a \$1.00 Reinstatement Fee. RENEW NOW!
