EDITORIAL

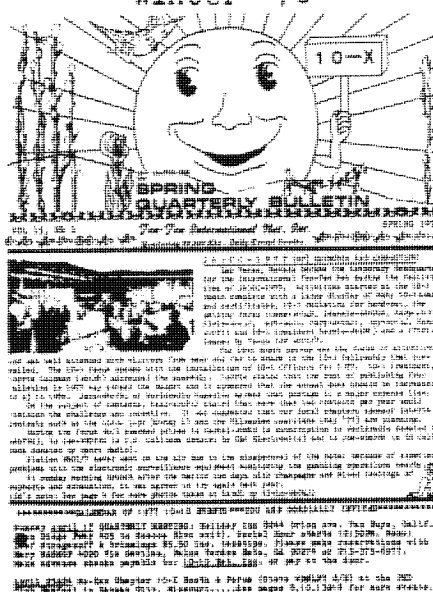
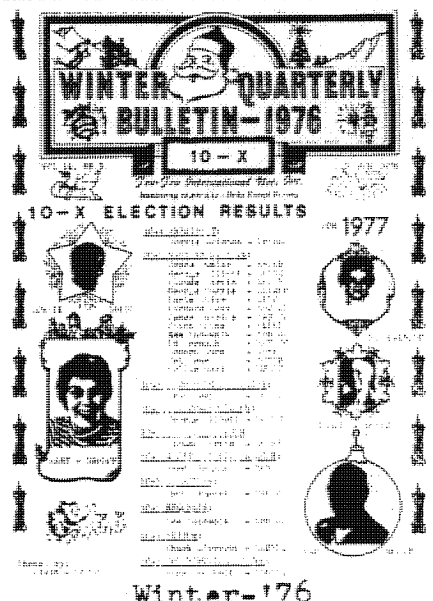
Our Cover Person this Quarter is: MORRIE GOLDMAN - W6EHM 10-10 #4189 of Torrance, Calif. Morrie is currently serving 10-10 International as a Director. He was 10-10 President from 1974 through 1977. Morrie is responsible for the special mailing of 10-10 News to all Chapter Heads and Area Managers (hand addressed labels) both in the U.S. and DX Countries. His behind the scene work has been and still is the backbone of 10-10 International. Morrie appointed me Editor back in December 1976 and he has been a tremendous source of assistance through those years past in producing the 10-10 News (then the 10-10 Bulletin) each Quarter.

With reference to the updated 10-10 Net Listing (pages 8 & 9) by Mickey Principe-KB5UP, he tells me that it is not error-free. This is due to the fact that some Chapters are not too co-oprative when it comes to letting him know of changes to 10-10 Chapter Nets. Be sure to let him know of all corrections needed for your Chapter's Net Listing. Mickey's address is: 309 Meadow Hill, Garland, Texas 75043. Mickey plans to update the 10-10 Net listing in the Summer '82 10-10 News. Each Chapter Head or NCS should send Mickey a post card and confirm your Chapter's net information. Keep in mind that any 10-10 Chapter that is currently in the "extinct status" will not appear in the Net Listing. Along with that last statement I might add that "extinct" chapters are not listed in the results of 10-10 QSO Parties. Remember to keep off of the "extinct" list just make sure you send activity reports to the 10-10 Co-Ordinator (Connie-K6EXQ) on a regular basis (at least once in any 12 month period since your last report) and in this way she is aware that your Chapter is still holding nets-and is active as a Chapter. To reinstate an "extinct" chapter the same procedure must be used to start a new chapter.

I received a request from Everett-KØJQC to publish a current list of "extinct" chapters so that 10-10'ers won't make the error of sending for their certificates or propagating their #'s. So..... here it is: Dolphin, Whaling City, Wet Ten, Bermuda, World-Tail-End, Buccaneers Of Tampa Bay, Michigan Sunday Ten Net, Hoosier Hills, Mountain State, COLA, Ottawa Valley, Father & Son, Hiawatha, Elgin Watchtower, Merry England, Flatland Farmer, Beale Street, Sionilli, Kentucky Plug Horse, Big Nickel, Shrimp Net, N. New Jersey, Piedmont, Red River Valley, Superman, Chattahoochee, Prairie State, Choo-Choo, Keystone, ORCA, SLOT, United RAC, Powell River, N. Georgia, War Eagle, Magnolia, Pelican State, Agassiz, Wessex, West-Pac, Middle Tennessee, Royale Hawaiian/Aloha State, Flandre-Artois, Blue Mountain Lagoon, Sun Country, Sitters, Golden Horseshoe, Little Mermaid, Panama Canal and Sleepy Hollow. For Chapters being declared "extinct" this Quarter see the Chapter Chatter Section starting on page 26.

Words from the President

DURING MOST OF MY PROFESSIONAL CAREER I was involved in research of one kind or another. One of the more difficult kinds to carry on satisfactorily is that of trying to trace the history of some kind of activity where few or no written records now exist. That is what Jim Michaels, W6PGM, was up against in his account of the early days of 10-10, which appears further along in this 20th anniversary issue. The recollections of old-timers often do not coincide, names and call signs crop up briefly and then disappear, and the records of meetings, activities, and members are no longer to be found, or never existed.

Oddest fact of all: there appears to be no record or clear statement of how or when the first few hundred 10-10 numbers were assigned. It is known that in some fashion it was done by lot. Jim holds No. 10, but agrees that the assignment of such a low number to him was pure chance. That he has been able to pull anything together at all is a tribute to his hard work.

THERE ARE A NUMBER OF privately produced and sold items which feature either or both the name of 10-10 and its insignia, and some of which include 10-10 numbers as well. Some that I recall having seen are QSL cards, two different kinds of badges, a book giving the requirements for earning and the sources of various chapter certificates, and now a very attractive line of jewelry. Maybe there are others as well, of which I do not know.

The line of jewelry is the brainchild of Gary Engleman, K5HGL, of Garland, TX. If you are interested, drop him a line. However, I do want to make one thing clear, and that is that 10-10, as an organization, does not sponsor or recommend any of the ventures I have mentioned.

THOSE OF YOU WHO CHECK IN regularly on the daily net know that the Friday net control was "Smitty" Smith, who used the phonetics, "Everybody Pays Taxes" for his call sign, K6EPT. Some weeks ago, Smitty was hospitalized, and regular reports on his condition were supplied by W6PGM, who was in touch with Smitty's family. On a Sunday evening in early December, Jim called me to let me know that Smitty had lost the fight at 1:30 that afternoon. 73, Smitty.

During Smitty's last illness, several members substituted for him as Friday net control. More often than most, it was Hillis Hauck, K6DQA, who is OM of Connie Hauck, 10-10's Chapter Coordinator. "Sherm" Sherman, K6PTF, who is manager for the international net, tells me that Hillis has agreed to take over the assignment on a regular basis as of January 8, 1982.

IT PROBABLY DOESN'T INTEREST YOU TO KNOW that what you are reading here is a complete rewrite of what I had originally prepared for this issue of the News. However, with my hunt-and-peck system, that represents quite a chore. But so many things had happened since I prepared, and nearly sent, the original copy to Editor Chuck Albrecht that I had no choice but to rewrite. Just yesterday I learned that Bob Holmes, WA6NOP, who is Thursday net control, had been hospitalized. His XYL tells me that he looked and felt much better last evening.

What I had originally written about Bob was that he told me he had heard of a number of requests to set up a 10-10 AM net up in the high end of the band. He was willing to coordinate requests and proposals for such a net, but his willingness, of course, would be based on his ability to do the necessary work. I don't know whether Bob had done anything to publicize this, but if he did, and some of you are burning to send him your ideas, please hold your fire until further notice. When Bob is well again, and back on the air, we'll let you know about it. Meanwhile, Sherm tells me, Jack Smothers, WA6YJJ, will handle the net on an interim basis.

DX MANAGER HARRY SYRING, WBLFTQ, tells me that he is going to mention on his page the possible need for a Canadian manager. The Board of Directors of 10-10 is responsive to the idea; we have far more Canadian members than from any nation outside the U. S. Like other 10-10 jobs, this one carries no pay and a lot of responsibility and gripes. Anyone who wants to volunteer for the job should write me at 5872 W. 77th Place, Los Angeles, CA 90045. The Board of Directors will review applicants and make the appointment. Expenses are reimbursed, but one always forgets something.

AND, SPEAKING OF MANAGERS, we're going to have a new one in the seventh call area. Bobbie Vaughan, WB7NUU, who has held the job for some time, has been looking unsuccessfully for a replacement. Most of you know that Willie Madison, WB7VZI, has taken over the Bar awards from 100 - 900. Willie was scheduled to take over on January 1, but moved up his effective date to early December when it looked as though Bill Risher would have to move before January 1. Bill didn't move, and still had not in early January, but Willie took over and is doing just fine.

Now Willie has volunteered to take over the seventh call area managership as well, and will do so effective February 1, 1982. By the time you get this issue, Willie will be in business on that job as well, and you'll find him listed for that area on page 2 and page 31, as well as here. Willie's address is 10512 W. Butler Drive, Peoria, AZ, 85345.

MANY 10-10 MANAGERS HAVE BEEN AT IT for quite a few years, so they must find it personally rewarding. Some are retired, while others work full time. Of course they get gripes from members, and most gripes seem to get handled at that point, since remarkably few get through to me. One problem: when members write about something, they often just don't include enough information. Suggestion: if you're going to write about some problem, include all the information you think the manager will need, then go back and add the things which are so obvious to you that you don't think he (or she) will need them.

The Annual Meeting of 10-10 International Net, Inc. was held on Nov. 8, 1981 at Woody and Eddie's Restaurant near Pasadena. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance and followed by a few moments of silence for Silent Keys. The Secretary's report was read, corrected, and accepted.

Morrie Goldman, W6EHM was confirmed as a member of 10-10's Board of Directors. As a Director, he has been responsible for purchase orders and advance mailings of the News. His confirmation was unanimous.

Treasurer Gerry Gross, WA6POZ, reported that there had been somewhat higher expenditures during the second quarter, and that a change in computer services to be made soon would result in a saving. President Howard Bowman, W6QIR, further explained the change in computer services, and requested that all members look closely at News mailing labels for errors.

Jim Michaels reported on work he is doing in connection with the 20th Anniversary Issue of the News. First Secretary Joan McDonnell, WA6QKC and OM Dunc, K6LHA had photos of early get-togethers, and Grace Dunlap, K5MRU sent a copy of the first contest certificate.

Next luncheon is scheduled for early February, at a place to be announced later. Reservations will be made to K6AYU.

Also enclose alphabetic list of states with full information on each contact, your own complete information, including 10-10 Number, and \$2.60 U. S. funds for certificate cost and postage. THE HISTORY OF 10-10

Seldom does the story of an organization's founding outlive the memory of those who founded it. The members that come after search diligently among the midden and potsherds of notes and fragmentary minutes for their beginnings and often in vain.

So it is rapidly becoming with the 10-10 International Net. To those who could have recorded it, the work of founding and organizing was only their day to day activities; the thoughts and impulses that motivated their acts were normal, familiar processes which needed no recording.

So we grope for much of the story of our beginning. The gaps in what remains to us, though little more than twenty years have passed, must be filled in with assumptions and the passing memories of the early recruits.

This much is certain: that when the list of founders is set up, the name of Irv Hunter, K6PWO, of Glendora, California stands pre-eminent. The 10-10 International Net is the projection of his thoughts; the 10-10 spirit is the reflection of his enthusiasm, the growth of 10-10 (1962-1982) is the fruition of his labors.

Around this man with his idea, there gathered a group who saw hope for ten meter activity with this innovation....and so it was born, though the nursing period was still ahead. Out of these amateurs intelligence of approach to the organization's problems and needs, the character which sets 10-10 apart was formed, that character which sets it apart as distinctive among amateur radio nets. To put a date on our history, we must go back to a spring day in March of 1962.....

Ten meters had been roaring during the fifties as many of us can attest. Then came the sixties and with it a bad case of the doldrums. Lack of good propagation, and the resulting lack of interest, caused many amateurs to abandon ten meters for greener pastures. This mass exodus from the band was cause for concern, on the part of a lot of ten meter enthusiasts, for fear that this lack of activity might cause the FCC to consider reassigning this portion of the radio frequency spectrum to some other service. Sometime in 1961, Irv Hunter, K6PWO, (ex-W2WAT), started talking about forming an amateur organization to promote activity and every day use of the ten meter band. In March of 1962, word got around that a meeting would take place at San Dimas Canyon Park, near Irv's home in Glendora, for the purpose of forming such an organization. A picnic lunch was held on a Saturday and several hams from that local area attended....and thus the seed was planted.

Well, now for some of the discussion and decisions: What will we name this net? When shall we meet? What kind of net shall we have? What will be the time and exact frequency? What, if any, slogan shall we use and what will be the qualifications for a certificate of membership? All of these and many other things were given due consideration by this small group of stalwarts. Shortly thereafter, things started to fall into place.

It was decided that the net would meet every day of the week except Sunday at 10 AM local PST (1800 GMT). Aha, "See you on Ten at Ten"....a natural! So the name quickly became "10-10 Net". Suffice to say that for many technical reasons, relating to propagation and other factors, the frequency of 28,800 Kc. was chosen as the primary daytime net frequency.

Now, about the original certificates....there was an order placed on 20 August 1962, with a local printer in Glendora, California, for 250 10"x12" black and white, Krome-Kote certificates and the total cost, at that time, was only \$16.95 including sales tax! The caption on that original certificate read as follows: Ten-Ten Net Southern California. (Author's note: The numerical version "10-10" appears on the latest corporation papers. Also, I have no information where the often used "10-X" originated.) The original certificate included crossed flags at the top (USA and California) and with the exception of the crossed flags, caption and the later world map, has remained essentially the same for all these years.

It was also decided that in order to qualify for membership in the 10-10 Net an amateur must "successfully work the required number of 10-10 Net members" before being entitled to that certificate. Speaking only for myself, it was necessary for me to check-in to the same local Net Control station ten consecutive sessions (and work 10 members) before I qualified to become a full member and that Net Control station was K6ZPW, Scout Grey Eagle, otherwise known as "Eagle".

As with most organizations, we experienced our share of growing pains. I have taken the liberty of summarizing a report from an early bulletin published in April 1965. This may have been one of the major turning points in the early days. The following article was written by Ed Steinback, W6VEE, then President of 10-10....

"So much for past events, lets take a look at the future. I would like to digress a moment first and then return to the subject at hand. The Ten-Ten Net of Southern California was originally organized for the purpose of activating Ten meters. The original goal has been very successfully accomplished but this has not come easily. It has resulted from the tireless efforts of the originators. However, the opinion of some of the net members and myself is that we have reached some sort of a crossroad which requires a decision and direction of future goals. Our by-laws and preamble state that we are a traffic net and perhaps by our standards we are. By ARRL standards, and even a laymans comparison of other traffic nets, we fall short of satisfying the requirements for a traffic net. There are various avenues to take but perhaps only three are prominent as well as being applicable to the net."

"The first and most obvious, which would also be the easiest, is not to make any major changes. Minor ones, yes, such as: clearing errors from the existing by-laws, etc. However, I would personally recommend removing the "traffic" portion of the net from both the by-laws and preamble."

"The second alternative would be to really start handling traffic. Major changes would be needed to accomplish this."

"The third alternative would mean work but from the standpoint of self satisfaction, accomplishment, recognition and true meaning of Amateur Radio Service, it would have the greatest payoff. This would be the affiliation with the ARRL National Traffic System."

Well, this certainly was a serious situation and needed the attention of all of the officers and members. What the details were regarding this matter are now a part of 10-10 history and the pros and cons are purely academic. So, another milestone was passed and a hurdle jumped. The fact remains that the 10-10 Net is very much alive and growing by leaps and bounds.

10-10 HISTORICAL "TID-BITS"

Our "Number One" gal, Grace, K5MRU became a member in January 1968 and won the first 10-10 contest in 1969.

Earle, W1NC, First District Manager, became a member in November 1968 and he stated that at that time it took him about 8 months to get the required ten contacts with members !

From Fran W6MXT....(Sometime between 1967 and 1971) "The rush began and Claude, W6LRY, was flooded with letters. His daughter helped him but in 1972 the letters were in a pile 2 months high so President Ed Blore, WB6LWW, temporarily put a stop to the application letters and restructured the system with 4 asst. certificate managers."

The first certificate printed with color was issued to Joe Baltzer, W6CKS, Whittier, Ca. ON 16 January 1966

The total membership was approximately 90 as reported in the Nov. 1964 Newsletter. In the same bulletin, it was reported that there were now 10 members operating on "Single Sideband" and that the net control preamble would be changed to read: (Insert after late or missed check-ins) "Are there any single sideband stations who desire to check in at this time?".

There were 135 member certificates issued to DX stations with 10-10 numbers lower than #1000.

10-10 INTERNATIONAL NET SPRING CW QSO PARTY -1982-

STARTS: 0000Z (UTC) March 6, 1982
ENDS: 2400Z (UTC) March 7, 1982



Ten-10 QSO Parties are open to all amateurs, but only members are eligible for awards. They are intended to encourage interest in 10 meter operation rather than to be a demonstration of technical or endurance abilities. Members may use the 10-10 numbers collected for the bar awards; others may use them to qualify for membership.

RULES:

1. All contacts must be made on 10 meters between 28 and 28.5 MHz.
2. Exchange call sign, name, city, state and 10-10 number.
3. Novices sign /N; technicians sign /T.
4. A station may be counted only once.
5. Single operator stations only (no multi-op) are acceptable.
6. CW and RTTY modes are acceptable.
7. All contacts must be within the 48 hour contest period.
8. QRP class limit is 10 watts output.
9. Logs must be in UTC (Greenwich or Zulu time).
10. Chapter assignment of scores may be only by a chapter member to a local chapter (one workable via ground wave).
11. Illegible or improperly submitted logs will be rejected.
12. Anyone failing to comply with these rules may be disqualified, and the judges' decision is final.

SCORING:

1. Two points for each contact with a 10-10 number exchange.
2. One point for contacts without 10-10 number exchange.
3. One additional point if contact is a novice or technician.

AWARDS:

FIRST place certificates, and first place QRP class certificates to all U.S. call areas, AL7, KH(), all VE districts, South America, Central America and the Caribbean, Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia, New Zealand and South Pacific. Individual and chapter scores are published in the 10-10 International News.

RTTY USERS NOTE:

This QSO Party is open to RTTY mode as an experiment. If enough logs are submitted, RTTY will be given separate scoring and awards. Suggested baud rates are 45-Baudot and 110-ASCII.

LOG SUBMISSION:

Logs are accepted from members only and must be legible, in UTC, and complete. Each entry must include call sign, date, time, name, QTH, and 10-10 number (if any). A cover sheet is required, showing your name, call, QTH, 10-10 number, chapter assignment (if any), total contacts, total points claimed and mode. If QRP class is claimed, note that and the output power. If there are more than 200 contacts a dupe sheet is required. Send logs to the tallying chapter as early as possible but not after the final submission date.

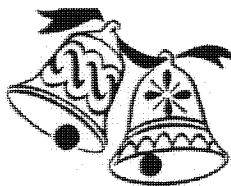

Novices, foreign applicants need work only 5 present members; novices pay no Registration Fee. You will receive a Certificate, and be assigned a permanent 10-10 Number. You must pay annual dues to remain in good standing, receive the News, and participate fully.

How to earn Bars and Plaques

Log the 10-10 numbers of stations you work on 10 meters, all bona-fide number exchanges on the air. Then list 100 only, no more, no less, no duplicates, thus:

1. List in serial order of 10-10 numbers. Show call, handle, location.
2. Submit only one list of 100 at a time.
3. Log books or copies of log book pages are not acceptable.
4. Give your name, address, call sign, 10-10 number, and state which Bar you are requesting (i.e., 100 Bar, 200 Bar, etc.)
5. Enclose a large size SASE.
6. Mail as follows: 100-900 Bars, Willie E. Madison, WB7VZI, 10512 W. Butler Dr., Peoria, AZ 85345. 1,000 Bar and up, Bill Risher, WB6OMH, 10542 Loch Avon Drive, Whittier, CA 90606.

With your 500 Bar comes an honorary V. P. Number, and other activities. A 500 Certificate costs \$1. Plaques are awarded for 1,000, 2,500, 5,000 contacts, and cost \$3 each. Make checks payable to 10-10 Int'l Net, Inc.

How to earn WAS

After working and getting QSL card confirmation on one member in each of 50 states, prepare alphabetic list by states with full data on each contact. Mail to Larry Wilker, W4ORH, 1479 Austin St., Dunnellon, FL 32630. U. S., Canadian, Mexican members send \$2.42, U. S. funds, for return postage and certificate. Overseas members see page 6 for new optional method.

Chapter Activities

Many 10-10 chapters issue certificates which may be earned by following rules established by those chapters. See "A Guide to 10-10 Nets" for days and times when chapter nets meet. Is it That Time?

Look at the mailing label on this issue of your 10-10 INTERNATIONAL NEWS. In the center of the top line there is a four-digit number which tells you the expiration date of your 10-10 membership. The first two digits indicate the month, and the last two the year. If your membership has expired or is about to expire, RENEW NOW. Send your annual dues to the Manager for the Call Area that has the same number as in your own call sign. Foreign members should send renewals to the appropriate DX AREA Manager. RENEW NOW!

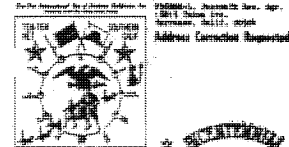

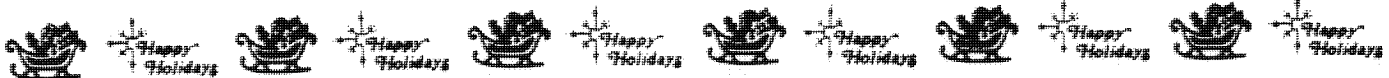
