The Dupe Sheet

A Dupe Sheet is a cross reference sheet for quick determination of whether or not a station has been previously worked in a Contest. It can take one of a number of forms, depending on the Contest, and whether or not a computer is used.

A Computer Contest program designed for use in a common contest such as ARRL, CQ, etc., will, in addition to printing your log, produce a Dupe Sheet consisting of a list of callsigns worked, sorted alphabetically. Depending on the particular program, it may be further sorted by call area, or some other criteria.

A contest program designed specifically for 10-10 Contests will produce a Dupe Sheet which is a list of 10-10 numbers worked in numerical order

10-10 Contest Rules state that a Dupe Sheet is required, but does not specify the form it must take, so either of the above is acceptable.

NOTE: "Computer Duping is Acceptable" does not mean that you don't have to include a Dupe Sheet, but that one of the above forms must accompany your log.

If you don't use a computer, the most popular form of Dupe Sheet is an 8 1/2 X 11" sheet, cross ruled into 100 rectangles. The rectangle in the upper left corner, is numbered "00", the next one "01" and so on, down to "99" for the rectangle in the lower right corner. These numbers represent the last two digits of a stations 10-10 number. The leading digits are penciled in when a Contact is made. Thus, when you work # 6100, simply write "61" in the rectangle marked "00", when your work # 50407, write "504" in the rectangle marked "07".

When the contest is over, go through your log line by line, filling in the Dupe Sheet as you go, and crossing out dupes as you find them.


New CW Award Announced





Then, type or rewrite your log, eliminating the dupes, (and rewrite your Dupe Sheet, too, if it's messy) and send both, along with your properly filled in Cover Sheet & Proof of Dues, to the scoring Chapter.

NOTE: Printing your log twice, or photocopying it, and sending two identical copies, does NOT meet the requirement for an acceptable Dupe Sheet. Keep in mind that the number one cause for disqualification of logs is failure to provide an acceptable Dupe sheet.



An-Ten-Ten-nas

In each issue of the **News**, we shall try to clarify a significant cluster of ideas used in antenna work. Our



object is to help you make the best decisions about the antenna you buy or build with out imposing our own prejudices on you. The more you understand, the better your choices will be.

No. 13 K4HJJ's 2-Element Minibeam

Glenn Blackwell, K4HJJ, #66998, presented an overview of his 2-element Yagi minibeam in the April, 1995, 10-10 News. Numerous 10-10 members have asked him how to build their own. Although he now sells a version of the beam, he encourages home brewing and has provided instructions to several hams. As a service to all 10-10 members, let's turn over the column to Glenn to show you how to build your own minibeam in the K4HJJ manner.

The minibeam is a 2-element Yagi with 8' elements and center loading. Although the gain will be under that of a full size beam, the front-to-back ratio will be a very respectable 15 dB or more. The price of small size combined with a high front-to-back ratio is narrow bandwidth, as Glenn describes below. His design is very transportable, as well as fitting into apartment and RV contexts. Here is how you roll your own, in Glenn's own words.

Select the element length: I use half-size elements, but you can go as low as 40% or you can go longer than half-size if it fits your junk box or hardware store. Keep both elements the same length. Let's try a half-size beam at 28.4 MHz. This will require elements approximately 8½ long, or two 4' elements with a 3" insulated mounting plate. Channel 2 TV hardware is excellent, but you can also use PVC pipe fittings to hold the 4' elements and house the loading inductor. PVC also works well for the 4' boom.

Approximate reflector inductor value: Traditional Yagis tune the reflector to about .95 of the beam's resonant frequency, or about 27 MHz. This proved to be too long for the minibeam. See Figure 1 for the reflector layout. Choose a coil to resonate with the loading inductor in place at

about 28.1 MHz. The resonant frequency can be lowered with the position of the capacitance loading wires. There are various formulas or charts, as well as computer programs, to find the values. You can also figure a 4' base-loaded vertical and double the inductance for a dipole element. I use ELNEC or ON4UN's software quite often to find the right values. The exact value of the inductance will vary with the length of the element and its diameter. Use two 7" pieces of #10 soft copper wire for capacitance loading, as shown in Figure 1.



Bend the loading wires away from the element to lower its frequency. Keep the inductor Q as high as possible. With a Q above 250, resistive losses are not great, but they grow quite drastically when the Q goes below 100. Keep the length-to-diameter ratio of the coil close to 1:1. Do not use a toroidal core.

Driven element construction: Repeat the construction process for the driven element. Divide the inductor as shown in Figure 2 to provide a feedpoint. At this time, do not resonate the element, since a matching coil will be added to the assembly.



Feedpoint inpedance: Determine the feedpoint impedance of the antenna (point X-X in Figure 2) either by computation or by direct measurement. ELNEC models with a front-to-back ratio of 15 dB show a feedpoint impedance of about 7.5 W. Now we are ready to design the matching network.

The Beta match: Using The ARRL Antenna Book, Chapter 26, Figure 32 (on the "hairpin" match), you can determine the reactance necessary to match 7.5 W. Calculate the inductance

for that reactance at 28.4 MHz. A coil of this value will substitute for the hairpin matching section. The coil, sometimes called a helical hairpin, is described in the *Antenna Book* in Chapter 6 in the description of a "Small Yagi for 7 MHz." See also ON4UN's chapter 2 on "Tuning or Loading the Short Dipole" in *Low Band DXing*.

ON4UN's coil design program calculated that the Beta match coil should be about 3 turns of wire, 7/8" in diameter, and about 1" long. With the coil installed, the driven element looks like the sketch in Figure 3.



Resonating the driven element: With the matching coil in place, resonate the driven element to 28.6 MHz without the capacitive loading whiskers. You can compress or expand the matching coil and change the electrical length of the antenna by adding the whiskers and changing their position. All the inductors should be covered because rain will change the loading conditions.

The bandwidth can be widened to about 600 kHz by tuning the reflector lower in frequency. You can also narrow the bandwidth: I have narrowed it to about 400 kHz to achieve a higher front-to-back ratio in the Novice-Tech phone band by tuning the reflector higher in frequency. Use a beacon and horizontal antenna at least 100' away and behind the beam to adjust the reflector whiskers for about 20 to 25 dB front-to-back ratio at 28.350 MHz, as determined by your receiver. You can achieve a higher front-to-back ratio, but the match and bandwidth are degraded. At 20 dB front-to-back ratio, I get approximately 350 kHz at less than 1.2:1 SWR.

The whisker loading is my design and shows no degradation in side lobe rejection due to a lack of symmetry. (I call it Capacitance Assisted Tuning or C.A.T. Whiskers after my cat Scooter.) Other types of matching may also be used. I believe that the hairpin coil, in conjunction with the center loading, gives the effect of an unbalanced to balanced transformer. In any event, the element currents are in balance and no feedline

or other spurious radiation has been detected.

This may look like a simple project, but expect to spend considerable time getting everything right. If you do build this antenna, good luck, and drop me a line.

It is essential information about using the system effectively, as well as some fundamental principles of e-mail list courtesy. Please keep a copy of this message beside your computer

Remember that the tenten-I is open to anyone interested in 10-meter hamming, not just to members of 10-10. However, with the traditional 10-10 helpful and friendly personality, many of these folks may soon become members.

Welcome to the Internet 10-10 mailing list! PURPOSE: The 10-10 mailing list is open for discussion of any subjects relating to 10-10 International and 10-meter amateur radio operation. Sample topics: propagation and band openings, equipment and antennas, 10-10 and chapter awards, new 10-meter activities. This sample does not limit the topics for discussion and questions, so long as 10 meters, 10-10, and amateur radio are the focus.

MESSAGE ADDRESSES: To send a message to all subscribers to tenten-I, address it to:

tenten-l@Lehigh.EDU.

Please indicate briefly, but accurately, your topic on the subject line. (Those with limited on-line time may wish to scan headings only to save time and money.)

To obtain information, a list of subscribers, postpone receiving list mail, remove yourself from the list, or receive other helpful messages about the list, please address messages to:

listserv@Lehigh.EDU.

These messages are called "command messages." They need no subject-line entry. The body of the message should contain only one command and no other content. *Note:* addresses are not case sensitive. A message to:

LISTSERV@LEHIGH.EDU and one to:

listserv@lehigh.edu

will both arrive successfully.

COMMAND MESSAGES: Here are some useful command messages: To subscribe (don't

forget to use your full first and last names AND your call)

To ensure that you are correctly listed on this list, be sure you subscribe with your first name, last name, and call, each separated by a space. If you are mislisted, UNSUBSCRIBE and then SUBSCRIBE using the correct format.

If you would like to receive any of the following:

- 1. the address of another station and/or
- 2. the heading and distance to that station, send the following command:

RUN TENTEN-L X CALLS2DIST <yourcall> <othercall>. Sample:

MAIL LIST COURTESIES: The purpose of the mail list is communication. Just as there are on-the-air courtesies we extend to everyone, so too there are e-mail list courtesies to observe. Here are a few:

- 1. Keep messages as brief as the subject calls for.
- 2. When replying to a message, do not include more of the original message than is necessary to answer a question, make a comment, etc. Delete all parts not necessary to the reply. Better yet, paraphrase the relevant lines and omit the original message from the reply. The subject line will often say enough for recipients to follow the thread from message to message.
- 3. Consider whether a reply should go to the sender alone or to the entire group. If the reply is relevant only to the sender, address your message to the sender and not to the list. If you ask a question, you may request that replies be direct. Then, if the replies are of greater interest, you can summarize them in a message to the list.
- 4. There is a difference between expressing strong views and being discourteous ("flaming" other messages). Respect others on the list and be courteous in all messages, even if you are expressing a disagreement.
- 5. Respect the interests of others on the list. Only a some of the subjects discussed will directly interest you. Please do not criticize others (on the list or directly) for exchanging messages about subjects outside your interests.
- 6. Do NOT send command messages (subscribe, unsubscribe, help, etc.) to the list. Send all command messages to the list server.

This list is not complete. Nor is it a list of commandments. However, if we translate the Amateur Radio Operator's Code into e-mail terms, then we have a good sense of proper and

productive e-mail communications.

INFORMATION FILES: There is an anonymous FTP repository on host ftp.Lehigh.EDU in directory pub/listserv/tenten-I. This directory will hold directories divided by relevant names for things relating to this group or radio amateur topics in general, including the archives of the mailing lists from the past and whatever relevant contributions members come up with.

To access the directories and files via ftp, do the following:

ftp ftp.Lehigh.EDU cd pub/listserv/tenten-l

You will see directories like fcc, rigs, Archives-old, Archives. There is a README file at this level to give you some information on what is in each directory and it will be updated as information is added to directory(ies). Note that files are compressed, i.e. end with .Z, but if you ftp without the .Z extension, the file will automatically be uncompressed. All files will be in ASCII except .gif and .jpg files when they become available.

As new files are added to the FTP repository, we shall announce them via list postings and in 10-10 News. All files in the ftp repository are also available via e-mail from the list server (address: listserv@Lehigh.EDU). To obtain an index of all files use the command

INDEX TENTEN-L-ALL

To retrieve a file via e-mail, send the command:

Sample: GET TENTEN-L/DX DXCC.LIST where "filepath" is the path as shown by the INDEX command, and "filename" is the name of the file you want. Note that the file is sent in UUENCODE format if it is a binary file and in plain ASCII if it is regular text. At present, all files in the archives are ASCII text files.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE MAIL LIST: This mailing list is maintained by ListProc 8.0c. Always send commands in the body of an e-mail message (the subject is ignored) to:



TenX DX News

I have a new vanity callsign: N5MT. Since I upgraded to Extra years ago, I have been hoping to get a shorter call. I have been using: Norway 5 Many Thanks. If you can improve on the phonetics, send me your comments.

When Tom Henderson K4CIH temporarily took over the DX Awards Manager position from Al Sherman K1AS, a good decision was made to computerize the DX records. A computer program was designed and written by Jim Hardy K4HAV #17605, to take the DX application data and save that into a database. Tom started with my DX records but it took him a while to check my claimed countries because he did not get all the paperwork from Al. I sent him several upgrades to replace the missing paperwork, as he could not find all of my countries. This summer, Tom turned the job over to N5EJS Russ Gauthier #1525 who is now the DX Awards Manager. Russ looked at my records and determined I was still missing five countries. I resent my last upgrade which brought my count to 235 confirmed by the computer database.

I had the opportunity to meet Russ for the first time in September during a trip to Louisiana. He lives close to my relatives but over the years we had missed each other, so this trip I planned to take a day to visit. Since Russ is now the keeper of the DX records. I could not pass up an opportunity to see if there was a story that I could extract from this data. The records contain a lot of information about what countries have been active and who was operating. This data is on the form submitted for the DX award and now Russ has the task of putting all this historical data into the DX database. Back in September, Russ had about 20 percent of the data entered between himself and Tom when I visited. The US data will be finished soon, then the DX members will be out in last.


When I arrived, Russ give me a tour of the ham shack located behind his house and where he plans to put a tall tower up in the future. He has a big monoband yagi in pieces just waiting for a tower. We then went inside to his computer

setup where we settled in to look at the records. Russ pulled out my paperwork and then gave me a quick demo of how he handles the data entry. The process looked fine as long as the person submitting the form does all the necessary work of filling them out completely. On the front of the award form is the basic 10-10 data. On the back, you fill out the callsign, country name, QSO date and 10-10 number. The data entered easily and sorted alphabetically by country name which is different from the ARRL who use callsign prefix by country. This data will help the checking of new DX applications and upgrades, validation of country credit and tell us when a new country has been submitted. It also makes the process of identifying the country easier since there can be dozens of prefixes available for some countries. For example, the old USSR is a tangle of prefixes and without a correct cross reference, you can easily pick the wrong country!

My primary goal for this visit was to determine from the DX data the number of 10-10 countries that have ever been available! Al Sherman started the list in 1981 but he stopped keeping the list updated after a few years. So, I had been updating my own list with what I knew was current. There has never been a 10-10 number exchanged in all countries as of yet! So, what is the best count available? Ask Russ, well he didn't know the answer but I knew how to find it.

First, I started with the list I published that contains the known base list. Second, get the records of the most active members in the program. Compare their worked list with the base list. Third, add the new countries to my list and put on the 10-10 Web site for reference. Thanks to DJ4BE Joe Pusch #49153, who has the second highest country count with 210, AA4UF Rick



Skip for the ARRL Ten Meter Contest will be better than last year! As I said in my last two articles, the much improved skip is slowly returning on Ten. The DX opening this fall will start about 1500 Z for us in the middle of the US. I am sticking to my comments about May 28, 1996 being the start of Cycle 23. With the increase in average solar flux up above 100 last week and the predictions by NOAA, we have started the next cycle.

Propagation: Solar flux will range from 77-110 in the Winter of 1996, as I write this, the Solar flux is 91, the A index 4 and K index 1, about 20 points higher than last quarter! In the transition from cycle 22 to 23, expect large swings of flux as new spots appear near or above the equator on the sun. For stations in the Eastern US, expect a 15% chance of DX propagation to be East-West paths into Europe or Africa, for stations in the Western US, expect a 5% chance of DX into Europe. All of the US into South America, expect a 25% chance of DX skip. Expect continued Sporadic E Layer conditions during the winter to be 2-4 hop skip that will travel 500 to 2500 miles with fading. F Layer skip will return with cycle 23. Remember to listen for the beacons (28,175-28,3) to check conditions.

By following the rules for these awards and of the chapter upgrades and specials, then a lot of hassle will


be avoided. Remember the turn-around time for any application or upgrade is directly proportional to the legibility and accuracy of the application. Make it easy for the CM or award manager, make sure everything is by the book. Another complaint: a couple of CM's have been lax in the return of upgrades and seals to their membership. Everyone is willing to condone sickness, heavy work schedule, and other extenuating circumstances etc. Thirty days maximum for 'snail mail' upgrades is not unreasonable to expect, and two weeks maximum for e-mail is being more than reasonable. Remember, the award managers and the CM's, are volunteers and the majority of them are doing their best to turn these applications around, do your part by making it as easy for them as possible - follow the rules to the letter.

NEW CONTEST RULES

Effective January 1, 1997

The following rules apply only to the four (4) scheduled annual contests sponsored by Ten-Ten International. Rules for the special October "Sprint" contest are published in the *Ten-Ten NEWS*, available from the Contest Manager, or from the Ten-Ten web site.

- 1. PHONE contacts must be made in the 10-meter phone band on SSB, AM, or FM CW contacts must be in the 10-meter band on CW or RTTY.
- 2. Exchange callsign, Name. State or Country and 10-10 Number. Some stations may request your county or other 10-10 Chapter information.
 - Single operator stations only are acceptable.
 - 4. A station may be counted only once.
- 5. All contacts must take place during the 48 hour contest period.
 - 6. Logs must be kept in UTC time.
- 7. A DUPE sheet is required of all participants regardless of number of contacts made. Computer duping is acceptable provided that the program has a resident sort program internal that will print out contacts in an alpha-numeric sequence. Manual duping may be done by the 100 square grid method. An alpha-numeric list of all non 10-10 contacts must accompany the grid type dupe sheet. Sample Dupe sheets are available from the Contest Manager for an SASE.
- 8. Chapter assignments of scores may be made only by a paid-up member belonging to that Chapter as a local member and be able to work its net via ground wave.
- 9. Illegible or improperly submitted logs, or failure to comply with these rules or their intent will result in disqualification.
- 10. Disqualified logs will appear in the results as Check Logs. No logs will be returned.
- 11. SCORING: Two (2) points per contact with 10-10 number exchange. One (1) point per contact without 10-10 number exchange. Multiply this result by the number of legitimate prefixes worked. Example: K1 W1 KA1 XE2 JA6 count as 5 multipliers. Be aware you should carefully keep track of your multipliers as to not duplicate. A multiplier may be used only once, regardless of suffix. You need not submit a multiplier dupe sheet, but be aware that disqualification criteria is 10% for all errors.
- 12. CATEGORIES: The categories which you may submit your logs for are: Individual, QRP, Club. In all categories you may assign your score to your appropriate Chapter.
- 12a. Individual- Rules as stated previous. OM/ XYL or Families using one shared station with individual distinctive callsigns/10-10 numbers accepted.
 - 12b. QRP- Rules as stated previous plus the

transmitter output power not to exceed 5 watts output CW, or 10 watts PEP SSB or 10 watts output AM/FM.

- 12c. Club- Rules as stated previous. Club stations must be a legitimate club with a member-ship of at least 5 with a distinctive government issued callsign and have its own 10-10 number registered to the club. All members operating the Club station during a contest must be paid up members of 10-10. Although multi-operator class is not generally accepted, we will allow multiple operators in Club competition only, provided that a list of all operators with proof of paid membership accompanies the submitted logs. Multi-transmitters (2 transmitters operating simultaneously, sharing one call sign) will not be accepted.
- 13. Logs may be submitted for One (1) category only. Example: QRP/Club not accepted. Individuals compete against individuals, QRP against QRP and Club against Club.
- 14. Scores will be reported in the NEWS by call area in each of the three categories.

(individual, QRP, Club) along with aggregate Chapter scores.

AWARDS: First place certificates to each US Call Area. Alaska is included in Area 7. Certificates to Canada, South America, Caribbean (including Bermuda), Europe, Africa, Asia, and the Pacific (which includes Australia, New Zealand, Hawaii and all other Pacific islands) will be awarded in each category.

LOGS: Logs are accepted from paid-up 10-10 members only, and must be complete and in full compliance with the rules. A cover sheet is required showing name, call, full QTH, 10-10 #'s, membership expiration date, Chapter assignment (if any), total contacts with and without 10-10#'s, total multipliers, total points, your home area (which is where you operated the from. Example: W6XYZ operating while on vacation in Florida, would indicate his home area as 4. JA3ABC would use JA as home area.) The back cover of the NEWS satisfies these requirements and is highly recommended. If a cover sheet, other than the NEWS is used, then it must be accompanied by a copy of the members dues card. A cover sheet can be down-loaded from the 10-10 web site. A Dupe sheet must accompany ALL logs.

QUIET ZONE: It is requested that 10-10 members have the courtesy to observe a "QUIET ZONE" between 28.490 and 28.510 MHz for those to use who do not desire to be involved in contesting.





Mobile Notes By Gene Tyree N4ANV #18712

First let me introduce myself to you. My Name is Gene Tyree, N4ANV is my call. I live in Fayetteville, NC which is in the county of Cumberland. I have been a ham for nearly 20 years, and I have enjoyed every day of it. I began with 10-10 from the very beginning. I was operating on 10 meters one day in 1977, and a guy ask if I had a 10/10 number and I didn't know what he was talking about. The gentleman took the time to explain the purpose and need for having a 10-10 organization. I have tried to determine which one of those first 10 to 15 contacts in my 10/10 logs was so kind to take the time to explain this to me but I just don't know which one took the time to share. In just a few days I was busy

chasing those certificates with a 10/10 # of 18712, and have given it on the air many thousands of times since. My Wife Pat, KC4TBS, is also a ham, and her 10-10 is 57419, so catch us both for a YL-OM contact.

Other activities that I have enjoyed very much include Certificate chasing. I am Possom Trotter 3 C, and was one of the founders of this chapter. This chapter is still active and is a vital part of our local club. As

a 10/10 # collector I now have the 900 bar, and am preparing to summit over a thousand more. My VP # is 2737. As a Possom Trotter I take part in our efforts to stay on top of the pile in the 10/10 QSO parties. You will find us listed with the rest of our Possom Trotter friends. During the last QSO party there were around 534 contacts made from my station, when you worked me, N4ANV, you also got My Wife KC4TBS, and our good friend PAT, N4UGH. I always tell the guys, it's

two Pats and a Gene for the price of one. Look for us in the next QSO party.

As for my mobile operating, I have operated from my mobile for many hours and many many miles. 




PAPER CHASING PERSONALITY
